Rules Of The Road

**Speed Limits**  
THE SPEED LIMIT FOR PASSENGER CARS IS 60 MILES PER HOUR, FOR TRUCKS 45, AND FOR PASSENGER BUSES 55.

**Hills And Curves**  
PASSING IS NOT PERMITTED ON HILLS, CURVES, OR WHEREVER A YELLOW LINE IS ON YOUR SIDE OF THE CENTER LINE.

**School Buses**  
IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO PASS ANY SCHOOL BUS THAT HAS STOPPED TO LOAD OR UNLOAD PASSENGERS.

**Night Driving**  
BRIGHT OR GLARING HEADLIGHTS MUST BE DIMMED FOR APPROACHING TRAFFIC AT NIGHT.

**Always**  
GIVE SIGNALS BEFORE YOU BEGIN TO CHANGE DIRECTION.
