(Known as Treaty 239)

Not harm any British people living in a community nearby

Not take from anyone when trading

Return all British prisoners especially British soldiers trying to run away

British Promises

(Known as Mascarene's Promises)

Can keep hunting, fishing and planting grounds

Practice their own religion with the permission of the priest

No harm should be inflicted on Wabanaki people
