Austrian Leader Predicts Revision of Citizenship Basis, Affecting Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, Nov. 9—The gradual introduction of an anti-Semitic policy, by the regime headed by Chancellor Engelbert Dollfuss continues. An early revision of the basis of Austrian citizenship is indicated by a speech made by a leader of the Christian Socialist storm troops, at a mass meeting held last

night in honor of Chancellor Doll-

The storm troop leader declared that while a complete withdrawal of citizenship rights would involve international complications by the creation of a new mass of staatenlose, persons without any citizen-ship, it was possible to create a differentiation in the economic life of Austria between citizens and to discriminate against the opponents of a "Christian" state.

He denied that this measure was rounded by anti-Samidan, but only by the desire of the Christian people for self-protection. The Neue Welt, Austrian news-

Cunliffe-Lister Announces Steps Against Illegal Entry Of Jews Into Palestine (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Nov. 9 - Vigorous steps to prevent illegal Jewish immigration into Palestine, were an-nounced today in the House of Commons by Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Secretary of State for the Colonies in the British cabinet. The measures proposed by the Colonial Minister are directed particularly against Jewish tourists. Jewish tourists coming from cer-

tain countries will be required to deposit sixty pounds as surety that they will not overstay, and only in exceptional cases will holders of Nansen, League of Nations, passports receive tourist visas for Palestine. Sir Philip classified illegal immi-

BUCHAREST, Roumania, Nov. 9—King Carol's disapproval of the anti-Semitic policy of the Roumanian students led by Professor Alexander Cuza, was openly demonstrated here by the king while attend-ing the opening of the University of Jassy.

The king refused to visit the dormitory of the Cuzist students, where elaborate preparations for his recep-tion had been made. Speaking at the ceremonies, King

Carol stressed the importance of the students abstaining from politics. "Your only duty is to concentrate on your studies, in which your strength lies," he told them.

The Cuzist students were infuriated and laid the blame at the door of the rector of the university. They accused him of having been responsible for the snub administered them by the nation's ruler. The anti-Semitic students stoned

German Jewish Fund Drives For Relief Work, Palestine Prohibited by Nazi Govt.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 9-An order pro-hibiting the Berlin Jewish community campaign for funds for Jewish charities was issued today by the authorities, who declared that such a campaign would necessarily compete with the Nazi campaign for winter relief.

It is learned that the government contemplates the prohibition of all existing Jewish collection drives during the duration of the Nazi win-ter relief campaign, including drives for the Zionist funds, the Keren Hayesod, the Jewish Foundation Fund, and the Keren Kayemeth, the Jewish National Fund.

Today's order also affects the Jewish community and the Central Committee of German Jews for Re-lief and Rehabilitation which had centralized the support for all Jewish relief activities all over Germany. Thus the relief body may find itself entirely dependent on foreign support for the maintenance of its work. The Gemeindeblatt, organ of the

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia, Nov. 9 -Czechoslovakia is proud of being able to offer a refuge to oppressed peoples, Edouard Benes, Minister for Foreign Affairs, declared today in reply to a motion introduced yesterday in the Czechoslovakian Na-tional Assembly to restret the stream of refugees from Germany. The measures introduced by the Agrarian party would prohibit the settlement in Czechoslovakia of all foreigners and would bar them from engaging in occupations in the coun-

Reelect Foe of Nazi Agents Head of N. J. German Group (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 9-Denouncing recent attempts by Nazi nouncing recent attempts by trans-sympathizers "to disrupt the unity of German-American elements here and elsewhere", the German-Ameri-can League of Essex County again unanimously reelected John C. Koerber, of this city and South Orange, as its president. Koerber was em-phatic in denouncing the "bombing" with Nazi literature of a German Day celebration in Springfield last summer, and generally has frowned upon Hitlerite overtures to his people.

That Koerber's attitude meets with the confidence of the League members was indicated by the fact the door. that the by-laws were suspended in order to permit his election for another year. At the same time the members affirmed "the solidarity of the organization with Koerber in his stand against uncalled-for activities of Nazi propagandists."

Nazi Commissar Wants More Jewish Doctors Ousted (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 9-Sixty per cent of the doctors on the sick fund panels in Berlin, which are supported to some extent by the government, are still Jewish, the Reichs Commissar for medical matters declared in an article in the Deutsches Aerteblatt, organ of the German doctors. He urged the organizers of the "cleansing" movement to con-tinue their work and not to relax their efforts, particularly in Berlin, where, he declared, the problem of eliminating the Jews in the medical profession was most difficult.

Mrs. Maria Griebl, wife of Dr. I. T. Griebl, and hostess to Spanknoebel during his stay in New York, also testified.

Reversing her former decisions, Mrs. Griebl appeared before "a Jewish district attorney and Jewish court", and she consented to swear on the Holy Bible, which she had previously earmarked as "being based on the old Jewish Testament." Last week Mrs. Griebl refused to testify before the grand jury, claim-

ing that she would not be questioned by a "Jewish district attorney or judged by a Jewish grand jury", be-cause "neither would be tolerant or just in their conclusions". She also refused to take her oath on the Holy Bible, claiming it was based on the old Jewish Testament.

Yesterday, however, following the advice of her counsel, Robert Mc-Gauley, who requested her to waire her constitutional rights, she submitted to questioning by Federal Attorney Medalie and the grand jury, one member of which is Jewish, and made no demands to be allowed to swear on the American flag.

Following the testimony, Mrs. Griebl ran through the line of newspapermen lining the hallway, dodged news photographers, and gained the stairway before cameras could be borught into focus. Mrs. Griebl is said to be of Jewish origin.

Miss Rose Fischer, serving maid in the Griebl home, who has previously testified before the grand jury, joined her mistress in their dash to Captain Schmitt, a half hour later,

emerged from the grand jury room surrounded by a large bodyguard of members of the League of Friends of New Germany, who had accom-panied him to the federal building. Looking neither to right nor left the Hitlerite representative plunged through press lines, stoutly refusing to respond to a barrage of questions which were flung at him from all Clicking cameras found his face shielded from the flare of flashlights by his derby. celebration of German Day at Madison Square Garden on December 6, were awaited, spokesmen for the Steuben Society, sponsors of the affair, announced that plans were incomplete and would not be revealed for a few days.

In the meantime it is believed that Ambassador Hans Luther will be invited to address those taking part in the celebration, a situation which demands the display of the swastika emblem.

Pending definite decision on this phase of the program, Jewish lead-ers in New York are withholding protest against allowing the cele-bration to be held.

According to resolutions already agreed upon by various German Jewish vereins, Jews will take no part in occasions at which the swas-tika is displayed. It is reliably learned that the resolution will hold true for the projected German Day festivities.

3,903 Jews Enter Palestine (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

IERUSALEM, Nov. 9-Four thousand and sixty-two immigrants settled in Palestine during the month of September, according to official fig-ures. Of this number, 3,903 were Jews.

The Tewish immigrants included 51 registered tourists, 450 immigrants who entered the country under the capitalist classification with capital of at least one thousand pounds (about \$4,900), 507 dependents of immigrants in the capitalist classification, 1.254 workers and 1,175 dependents of workers.
