THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF CAMEROON

In 2019, the production of mineral commodities represented only a minor part of the economy of Cameroon (International Monetary Fund, 2020, p. 29–32). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Cameroon is provided by law No. 2019/008 (Petroleum Code) and law No. 2016/017 (Mining Code). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities.
