WORK EXPERIENCE

The ND program is broadly composed of three main areas of study, the biomedical sciences, the clinical sciences and the art and practice of naturopathic medicine. The biomedical sciences segment of the curriculum provides an in-depth study of the human body through lectures and labs. Students take courses in anatomy (including gross anatomy, prosection, neuroanatomy) embryology, histology, physiology, biochemistry, environmental and public health (including immunology and infectious diseases), pharmacology and pharmacognosy. The clinical sciences segment of the curriculum thoroughly prepares students to educate patients and the public in health promotion, and disease prevention. It also prepares them to diagnose the causes of a range of primary care conditions and to effectively help patients manage their conditions using a broad range of therapeutic interventions. Laboratory and clinical demonstrations are utilized to foster the development of practical skills.

Diagnostics courses include: physical and clinical diagnosis, laboratory diagnosis, differential diagnosis, and diagnostic imaging. A variety of primary care issues are covered in courses ranging from natural childbirth/obstetrics to pediatrics. Primary care management is covered in the study of botanical medicine, homeopathy, emergency medicine, nutrition, physical medicine (including naturopathic, osseous and soft tissue manipulative therapy, physiotherapy, sports medicine, therapeutic exercise and hydrotherapy), psychological counseling, nature cure, acupuncture and Asian medicine, and minor surgery. A defining element of naturopathic medicine is the integration of naturopathic philosophy and principles with medical knowledge in the care of patients.

- Ensure that the teaching clinics of CCNM meet the highest standards of clinical education, clinical operations and patient care. These teaching clinics see over 31,000 patient visits a year and are staffed by 35 clinic faculty members, 110 student clinicians and 9 support staff.
- Member of the Ontario Naturopathic Coordinating Council which worked to garner legislative approval of The Naturopathic Act (contained within Bill 171). Collaborated with other NDs in the development of the Ontario Association of Naturopathic Doctors on a scope of practice document which was submitted to the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care during this process.
- Introduced a Faculty Performance and Development Plan to clearly communicate the college's expectations in the areas of patient care, professional leadership (including increased emphasis on scholarship), community service, institutional leadership and teaching. This plan is part of an overall institutional commitment to encourage and support faculty development either in the attainment of graduate degrees (5 faculty are currently enrolled in Masters programs) or other advanced training.
- Implemented Objective Structured Clinical Examinations utilizing standardized patients from the University of Toronto Standardized Patient Program. This exam provided an objective assessment of our student's ability to conduct a basic medical history and physical in a sensitive and efficient manner.
- Responsible for curriculum of the program from May 2007 to May 2008. During this time focused on developing an overall vision for the program and introduced better tools to provide feedback on the curriculum. Began the process of improving the overarching learning outcomes for the program, including the modalities.
- Oversaw the implementation of a semesterization of the final clinical year that requires students to pass both a qualitative (summative) and a quantitative (numerical requirements) evaluation. This change resulted in a more rigorous evaluation of student clinical ability and better learning as they worked at a consistent pace throughout the clinical year.
- Introduced focused clinical training in adjunctive cancer care, pediatric and sports medicine/pain management which provided an opportunity for students to get indepth training in these areas and enhanced the quality of care patients received.
- Implemented the Naturopathic Patient Database which serves both educational and research objectives. Students input health data and together with their supervisor generate a working diagnosis and a management plan. The patients response to the

management plan is measured by a validated assessment tool called Measure Yourself Medical Outcome Profile (MYMOP). This data in turn provides information which can be used to improved standards of care, inform curriculum and provide ideas for areas of research.

- Created and managed the clinic education and operational budget (over \$2 million) and implemented changes to both the clinical education curriculum and clinic operations that contributed to a 20% increase in patient visits over the past year.
