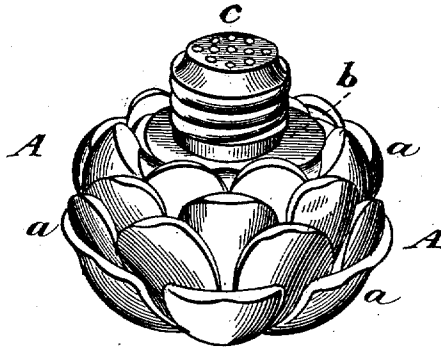
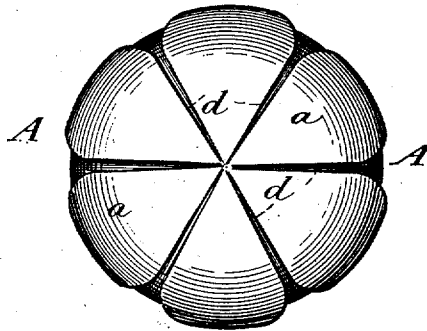

DESIGN FOR A CLOSED VESSEL WITH PERFORATED COVER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,566, dated March 10, 1891.

Application filed January 24, 1891. Serial No. 378,979. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NICHOLAS KOPP, a citizen of the United States, residing at Fostoria, in the county of Seneca and State of Ohio, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Closed Vessels with Perforated Covers, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a perspective view, and Fig. 2 a view of the under side of my design.

The leading feature of my design consists in the hollow body A, having the outline or shape of a flower of the rosaceous order, of which the rose is a genus, which when viewed in perspective, as in Fig. 1, has its petals *a* standing in the way in which they are ordinarily found in flowers of the order named when in bloom, and from the center of the body rises a neck or tube *b*, surmounted by the perforated cover or cap *c*. On the under

side of the design, as seen in Fig. 2, the divisions of the petals are represented by the lines *d*.

This design, which is intended for all classes of closed vessels provided with perforated covers or caps, may be executed in china, glass, or other ware, to which the natural color of the flower may be given, if desired.

What I claim is—

The design for closed vessels with perforated covers herein shown and described, representing a flower of the rosaceous order, of which the rose is a genus, the same comprising the body A, the petals *a*, and the neck or tube *b*, rising centrally from the body and surmounted by a perforated cover, substantially as set forth.
