Outline Description	Chapel dedicated to St Mary; known as 'Tal-Ftajjar'
Property Description	The 17th century chapel, although dedicated to St Mary, is commonly referred to by the locals as 'Tal-Ftajjar'. The rectangular-planned chapel is reached through a rectangular parvis. The plain facade is balanced by a doorway on both sides, and a centrally placed belfry at roof top level. The main doorway, located on the left of the facade, is enframed by a plain pilaster on either side supporting an entablature and a broken cornice. Set between the broken cornice is a small opening. At roof-top level, a cross is set on a small plinth decorated with a skull and crossbones, is centrally set above the main doorway. The secondary door is framed by a delicate moulding and crowned by an entablature and triangular pediment.
