[@] Brunhouse describes Shubart (*Counter-revolution*, p.20) as a Republican in 1776. However, voting patterns in 1778-9 show him as a consistent supporter of Constitutionalist positions.

It is probable that both Waggoner and McFarren took the oath without reservations. ? = Schmyser and Lowrey were reported as having taken the ath without reservation but voted consistently with Republicans. Again this is probably a typesetter's error.
