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


FROM THE EDITOR



THE TOWNS IN BOSSIER PARISH WERE NAMED BY EARLY SETTLERS



Bossier Parish was created February 24, 1843 out of a part of Claiborne Parish, itself created in 1898. Carved out of the Great Natchitoches District with Claiborne, Bossier's boundaries extended from the Red River on the west to the Dorcheat on the east. It was named for General Pierre Everiste Bossier, descendant of an early settler and a member of Congress when the parish was formed.

The newspaper THE FREE STATE OF BOSSIER issued at Benton, Lousiana September 27, 1900 (Volume 1, Number 1, page 2) then listed postoffices in Bossier as Ash Point, Allentown, Antrim, Ansel, Alden Bridge, Atkins, Arkana, Benton, Brownlee, Bossier City, Bellvue, Bodcau, Bolinger, Bluffs, Buckhouse, Carterville, Curtis, Durr, Emma, Ellison, Hughes' Spur, Haughton, Ivan, Koran, Linton, Loris, Midway, Mot, Plain Dealing, Roberta, Taylortown and Vanceville.

Early in the nineteenth century the first settlers came in from the eastern states. The Bossier area contained only a few hundred settlers until 1804. From 1804 to 1850 the population increased from a few hundred to 2,507 whites, and the the slave population for the same period increased from zero to 4,457.

In 1900, there was an immense saw mill plant located at Allentown, the Allen Brothers and Wadley being the proprietors of this town about three miles northeast of Haughton.

Antrim was another saw mill town and was located on the Cotton Belt Railroad about three miles south of Plain Dealing.

About forty miles north of Shreveport on the Cotton Belt Railroad and on the Louisiana and Arkansas line was Arkana with several stores, a saw mill, church and a post office.

Atkins was a station on the Red River Valley Railroad and was situated in south Bossier about twenty miles south of Shreveport. J. W. Atkins owned a saw mill there.

Brownlee was a flag station on the Cotton Belt Railroad about five miles out of Shraveport. Mr. W. Boney had a general merchandise business there. Brownlee Road and Brownlee Estates can be found on a modern map just north of Bossier City.

Bodcau was a station on the Vickburg, Shreveport and Pacific Railroad with one store.

The old town of Bolinger, now abandoned, was named for the late S. H. Bolinger who operated a large sawmill there.

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Bellevue was first named Freedonia when the parish was organized in 1843. The name lasted, however, but a month when it was changed to Society Hill. This name also lasted one month before it was changed to Bellevue by the Police Jury.

Collingsburg, another old town, was reduced to one store and a postoffice with the coming of the Cotton Belt Railroad. This community was situated in a well timbered area three miles northeast of Plain Dealing. Originally named for Eli Vance Collins who married Mariah Cavett in 1849, Collingsburg was originally known as Pineville.

Mr. A. Curtis had a general merchandise business on a small station of the Shreveport and Red River Valley Railroad south of what is now Bossier City. One of the schools in Bossier Parish is now known as Curtis Elementary.

One mile north of Alden Bridge on the Cotton Belt Railroad in north Bossier Parish was Hughes' Spur, named for Clark Hughes, speaker of the Louisiana House.

Fourteen miles south of Shreveport on the Red River Valley Railroad was the town of Taylortown, identified in 1900 as a "growing community." It then had a store, a doctor's office, several dwellings, a big gin and grist mill as well as the station.

Vanceville, a station on the Cotton Belt Railroad half way between Benton and Shreveport, was named for the Vance family who came from South Carolina and lived on a plantation named Palmento, now the site of the Palmento Country Club.

Most historians credit Fillmore with being the oldest settlement in Bossier Parish. It was named for U. S. President Millard FIllmore.

Redland (formerly Red Land) was named because of the red soil of that region.

Carterville got its named from an early resident by that name.

Sligo is located on the old Sligo Plantation and is named for the county in Ireland from whence came early settlers of the area.

Pleasant Hill was chosen by early settlers as a nice name for their pleasant community.

Midway was named because it was midway between Bellevue and Benton.

Princeton derived its name from Joseph Wilson Prince. It was first suggested to call it Princeville, but the name of Princeton was preferred.

Oak Hill, in the northwest corner of the parish, was named because of the oaks that dot the hills of the region.

There was once a postoffice at a place called Plainville, which was located just east of Plain Dealing.

There was once a post office at Mot, supposedly named for an old cow that had that name. The cow, it was said, was grazing nearby when the citizens met to name the place.

The village of Alden Bridge north of Benton was established by the Alden family, descendants of the Mayflower's John and Priscilla Alden. Isaac Alden, Jr., a son of Isaac Alden of Oneida County, New York, had come to Louisiana in the early 1800's. About 1832, his brother Philo came to Caliborne Parish, Louisiana, which parish he served as a deputy sheriff. Philo's son, George, was later to write, "In 1843 father removed to Bossier Parish to a place on or near the Red River, about 25 miles above Shreveport, which town was then only a small steam-boat landing.Father built a saw-mill on Cypress Creek, so called because of the enormous growth of cypress timber there. We ran the mill night and day, and could cut about 2,000 feet of lumber in 24 hours." Philo Alden served Bossier Parish as Sheriff. In 1900, according to THE FREE STATE OF BOSSIER, Whited and Wheless, manufacturers of lumber and general dealers in merchandise, were the principal property owners.

Benton was named in honor of Thomas H. Benton, United States Senator from Missouri, who was a champion in Congress for the development of the West by building of roads west of the Mississippi. He was the prime mover for the building of the road from Arkansas into Shreveport via Lewisville, Plain Dealing and Benton. This road was constructed in the 1820's and was a stagecoach line for many years. Benton was a protege of Andrew Jackson, who was an orator and leader in Congress for 30 years.

Heifner was named for the Heifner family, who were early settlers of that region. It is sometimes called the Alabama Settlement because the early settlers came from Alabama.

THE SHREVEPORT TIMES of August 26, 1884 carried the following announcement: "On and after September 1st, Lawrence Station on the Vicksburg, Shreveport and Pacific Railroad will be known as Haughton. Captain Dabney, superintendent, has established a flag station a half mile west of the draw bridge known as Dorcheat. This is done for the benefit of fishing and hunting parties. Flag station will be known as Dorcheat." Fourteen miles east of Shreveport, Bellevue was ten miles to the north and Koran ten miles south.

Plain Dealing was named after the Plain Dealing Plantation operated prior to the Civil War by George Oglethrope Gilmer. The town is located on part of that old plantation, but did not come into being until the coming of the Cotton Belt Railroad in 1888.

Rocky Mount was first called Keyserville for two men who put up a store at that spot. After their death, the store and land was sold to Noah Phillips, who built a house across the road, which was afterwards occupied by J. H. Hughes. Mr. Phillips changed the name to Rocky Mount because of its situation, The first of the settlers in Rocky Mount was William Young, who built some cabins on the branch north of the present town, the next year putting up a log house on the hill.

Bossier City was first known as Cane's Landing in pre-Civil War days. Two men, William Smith Bennett and James Huntington Cane, came up the Red River and opened trading post overlooking the river. Called Cane's-Bennett Bluff, it was later to be known as Shreve Town. Cane got a patent on some land on the other side of the river and established a plantation known as as Elysian Grove, made up of 600 acres. The family operated a store near the ferry landing on the Bossier side of the river. Then known as Cane City, the area began to really develop around 1884. A small village was laid out, which was incorporated in 1907 as Bossier City. It was proclaimed a city in the 1950's by Gov. Earl Long.

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CADDO PARISH'S SODA LAKE WAS NAMED FOR DE SOTO FAMILY

Recent research focused my attention on the northern reaches of Northwest Louisiana in what is now northern Bossier and Caddo Parishes. Contact with venerable cotton farmer Dan "Buddy" Logan, of Gilliam, led to a guided tour and a mention of Soda Lake. Buddy, having been a child in pre-automobile and pre-television days, remembered sitting under a tree in twilight hours of those days gone by e listening to stories handed down by earlier generations. One of the stories had been of the explorer De Soto and of the connection of that family name to the naming of Soda Lake.

Further research unearthed an article by the late Rupert Peyton which appeared in THE BOSSIER PRESS of 25 June 1970 under the title of "Bossier Parish in Retrospect." Information from that article is reprinted here;

"Bossier Parish was the first area of Louisiana to be explored by the white man. This fact is vouched for by chronicler of the De Soto expedition whose record is on file in the archives of Spain.

"This is contrary to the popular opinion that South Louisiana was first visited by the white man. It was more than a hundred years before LaSalle made his famous trip down the Mississippi and first viewed the site of the Crescent City.

"In 1541 De Soto led his band of explorers through Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and Arkansas. The band wintered at Hot Springs, Ark., and the following spring came down the east bank of Red River. That would have put them as the first white men to visit the state in what is now Bossier Parish.

"One of the most convincing evidences that Bossier was the first area of the state to be seen by the white man is the old chronicler's description of the territory bordering the east shore of the Red River. He went out of his way to describe the "flowering montanas' of the region. Montana is the Spanish word for little mountain, or hills, and the flowers he wrote of were undoubtedly the dogwoods and redbuds that bedeck the hills of the region in early spring, especially around Plain Dealing.

"The proof that De Soto visited this area was vouched for in the traditions of the old Coushatta Indians whose home was the village of Chouhshattaville which was located on the east bank of the Red River near Miller's Bluff just west of Plain Dealing. Early white settlers of this region told of the tradition of the Coushattas who told of a story handed down by their forefathers of a visit from "white gods" who rode on strange beasts and made "lightning and thunder." This evidentally referred to De Soto and his men who rode horses and fired their guns and cannon to the amazement of the aborigines.

"Zagal De Soto, a cousin of Hernando De Soto, was said to have died somewhere near Shreveport and Soda Lake is believed to be a corruption of the name De Soto."

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

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THE STORY WITHIN AN OLD PHOTOGRAPH

Suzanne Furgal, of Napierville, Illinois, recently sent THE GENIE a photograph she had purchased at an auction. Probably taken in the early 1900's, it is a picture of two teen age girls dressed for some special occasion, complete with Panama straw hats and rose corsages. Inscribed on the back of the photograph is, "With best wishes to Cousin Liz. This be my friend Lena Voelcker and old Mag." The photograph is credited to C. G. Kruse, 214 Texas St., Shreveport, La.

Research in old Shreveport City Directories at Shreve Memorial Library in Shreveport led to solving the identity of at least one of the girls, Lena Voelcker. The first available city directory is of 1881 and contained a listing for a Wm. Voelker, partner in Vaughn and Voelker, Carriage Makers, Milam near Edwards Street. The first separate listing for a Miss Lena Voelcker appears in 1900 with residence at 607 Christian Street, the same residence of a William Voelcker and wife, Marguerite, and a Louis S. The occupation of the two men is that of "blacksmith" at 417 Milam.

Information further gleaned from the city directories led to a telephone conversation with a member of that family who was found to be living within a few blocks of the researcher!

William Jasper was born in England, coming to America when a young man. He was adopted by a family by the name of Voelcker. A cabinet maker by trade, he married and had three children. The eldest, Frederick William, Jr., married Thelma Davidson, of Marshall, Texas, and had two children (Billy lives in Sacramento, California, and Peggy in Shreveport). Their daughter, Nellie, also married and has two sons, Howard and Berry. The youngest daughter, Wilhelmina, married Carl Lish, of Louisville, Kentucky.

After the death of his first wife, Frederick William Voelcker remarried. They had two children. Lewis was a musician. He played the flute. Lena, of the photograph, was the daughter. The last entry in a city directory for Lena is in 1965, when she is listed as living at 713 Austin Place. We were told she then went into a nursing home, where she died. She is buried in Oakland Cemetery.

Half of the mystery of the two girls in the old photograph is now uncovered. But who was "old Mag"?

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BIBLE RECORDS



This old Bible originally belonged to Mrs. Mary E. (Davenport) Mustin, of Augusta, Georgia. Inscribed on the fly sheet is "Mary E. Mustin, Augusta, Ga., Oct. 9, 1881. Information on the title page states that this Holy Bible contains the Old and New Testaments together with the Apocrypha, Concordance and Psalms in metre. It was published by the American Bible Publishing Company, 22 Park Place, New York, 1879. It is now in the possession of Mrs. Mustin's daughter-in-law, Mrs. Sallie Beall (Cooke) Mustin, of Waskom, Texas. Information concerning the Bible was contributed to THE GENIE by Billy R. Randolph, Waskom, Texas. Mary E. Davenport married Samuel Eli Mustin. They were the parents of Eugene J. Mustin of Waskom, Texas, who is now deceased. According to Mr. Randolph, Mrs. Mustin told him that Ann Elizabeth Mustin's father was an artist, though she did not know his name.

THE FORTSON TREK TO LA-TEX

The November 21, 1890 Shreveport marriage of James Calhoun Williams to Frances (Fannie) Fortson marked the end of the early trek of the descendants of Lt. Thomas to Louisiana amd Texas. Fannie was born near Bethany, the old town of Lickskillet in "Deep East Texas", and James spent twenty years as a western Texas pioneer. Now they were settling in the biggest city in the Red River Valley, leaving behind the plantations and ranches of Texas.

Fannie's great grandfather, William Fortson, came from Virginia with his father, Thomas, and his mother, Rachel Winn Fortson, in 1792. He married Ann Higginbotham and, in 1795, they settled in Elbert County along the waters of Beaverdam Creek. There they raised twelve of thirteen children born to them. Their seventh child was Fannie's grandfather, Elijah Satterwhite Fortson, In 1821, because both parents were descendants of Revolutionary War veterans, they received two draws in the Gold Land Lottery. By 1829 they had sold their Georgia plantation, bought land and settled in Green County, Alabama. They were joined by their daughter, Ann, and seven of their sons in the venture. Some of their sons soon moved farther west into eastern Mississippi. William died in 1840 and by 1850 only Ann and their son, Peter, were living in Greene County near Clinton.

On February 4, 1827, in Green County, Elijah S. Fortson married a native daughter of Alabama, Mary Ann Elizabeth Richardson. She bore Elijah seven children and five survived to accompany their parents on the second leg of the Fortson Trek. The oldest surviving son, Fannie's father, was Francis Marion Fortson. He was named in honor of the most famous Revolutionary War hero in the South.

The first of the plantations of the pioneering Fortson Brothers were owned by Aaron J. and William T. Fortson near Lickskillet on the Louisiana side of the "line." They were listed in the Blossom Hill Precinct of Caddo Parish in the census of 1850. Aaron had joined William in 1847. That was the year William's wife, Sarah, died and shortly thereafter he married Nancy Johnson Evans. In the fifties he bought large land holdings in De Soto Parish, built his large plantation at Gravel Point and moved his numerous slaves south. The post office established there in 1917 was called Fortson in honor of this pioneering family.


Elijah S. Fortson established his plantation in Panola County's piney woods country in the 1850's, working with his son, Francis. There they welcomed his brother, Peter, who later settled in De Soto Parish. Peter was a Baptist minister and Elijah's second son and his namesake. Elijah R. Fortson became a minister of the Gospel in Caddo Parish and it was he who performed Fannie's only marriage ceremony. Another of Elijah's brothers, Roderick, was a Baptist minister, had nine children and lived, after 1850, in De Soto Parish. Aaron served in the Confederate Army and had joined his brother Jeptha in Van Zandt County, Texas by 1880.

Bethany, the old general store at Lickskillet until early in the Twentieth Century, is on the La-Tex State Line. The line shifted around several times in the 1800's, and on the Texas side Lickskillet was on the Panola-Harrison Counties' line. Folks from Bethany could be living in either of these counties or in Caddo Parish and still be neighbors.

Grand Cane, Bracken and Hightower (Boggy) Cemeteries are all in the area. The grandfathe of Fannie and Uncle Elijah lie in Grand Cane, but her brother Elijah may be with them or in the cemetery a few miles west of Bethany. There Fortsons, like her brother, Francis Marion Fortson, II, lie alongside Hightowers, such as his wife Mary Hightower.

Many of Lt. Thomas Fortson's descendants have migrated to all parts of Louisiana and Texas and to Oklahoma and Arkansas. Some have lived on the West Coast for generations. It was, however, the children of his son William who built the communities and created the traditions of their Louisiana and Texas lands, completing the story of the Fortson Trek.

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THE AHNENTAFEL

The word Ahnentafel is German for "table of ancestors". And that is what it is. It puts all the facts about one's ancestry in an orderly table. Each person on the chart is given a number exactly the same as it would be on a pedigree chart. To find the father of a person, look for double the number of that person. In turn, the wife of that person may be found by adding one number. Since the father's number is always double that of the child, number 18 is the child of number 36, and the mother of number 8 is 17. The parents of number 17 are 34 and 35. Only basic facts which can be verified should be included and blanks left for unknown unverified facts.



BIBLE RECORDS



McPHAILL FAMILY BIBLE

This old leather bound Bible, measuring 10" by 15" by $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", once belonged to Duncan McPhaill of Harrison County, Texas. It is now at the Harrison County Museum in the old courthouse at Marshall, Texas. The title page is missing from the front, but the title page for the New Testament identifies it as having been published in London in 1798 with "arguments prefixed to the different books and moral theological observations illustrating each chapter composed by the Rev. Mr. Ostervald, Professor of Divinity and one of the Ministers of the Church at Neufchatel in Switzerland."

It was transcribed 10 December 1973 by B. R. Randolph, who felt at that time that though he copied two pages of family data an additional page might be missing. The writing was faded, almost unreadable in some places, and Mr. Randolph left dates blank where unreadable and placed a questionmark if undetermined.
