 The film depicts events leading to the bombing of Pearl Harbor in the interim after World War I. Kai Kappa is program chairman.

**ALL-NIGHT RUNS START SUNDAY ON Q-26 LINE**  
**Residents Win 3-Year Fight to Add 5 Hours Service on 'Toonerville Line'**  
 All-night bus service on the Q-26 route serving the Hollis Court, Emerald Park and Rosewood communities along the Flushing-Bayside borderline will be started Sunday by the Board of Transportation.  
 The "Toonerville line" through Hollis Court boulevard has been the target of criticism by civic associations over a period of years. Announcement of the new night service was made at a meeting of the Hollis Court Civic Association by Julius Feigenbaum, association president and recently at the forefront of a campaign begun in 1945 by the neighboring Emerald Park Civic Association.  
 The Q-26 buses cease operation nightly at 1 A. M. and don't resume until 6:20 A. M. They run to and from the Flushing business center and through the 46th and Sanford avenues and Parsons, Kissena and Hollis Court boulevards.  
 Rush-Hour Survey Too  
 Word of the round-the-clock service was accompanied by a board announcement that a general survey will be made of rush-hour operations on the Q-26 route to determine whether association demands for shorter headways are justified.  
 "We are sure the investigator will back us up once he sees the conga lines at Main street and Roosevelt avenue in Flushing waiting as much as a half hour for a Q-26 bus," Feigenbaum said.  
 "The board has to realize the communities served by the Q-26 are among the fastest growing in Queens and that bus service has not kept pace with the population increase."  
 Early Birds Numerous  
 In the fight for all-night buses, the Hollis Court association pointed out that many home owners in the new communities have jobs requiring travel during hours when no buses are running.  
 Association members recently dubbed the Q-26 a "Toonerville line geared to serve a farm community."  
 Protests were sent to Mayor O'Dwyer and forwarded to the Board of Transportation.  
 Three weeks ago, William Reid, chairman of the board, informed Feigenbaum that the matter would be given his personal consideration.  
 "We believe the board is making an honest effort to cope with the rapidly changing transit set-up in Queens," Feigenbaum said.  
 "The organization made plans for a Christmas party for children of members, but no date was set for the affair. The meeting was held at the Rosewood-Utopia Legion Hall at 48-46 204th street.

**Gifts Fly to Germany**  
 Six large cartons of Christmas gifts, sent by the girl scouts of Greater New York, were delivered today to needy children in Frankfurt, Germany. The gifts, which were flown to Germany by the Seaboard and Western Airline from Idlewild airport, were distributed there by the American Friends Service Committee.  
 Six girls, representing the 37,557 scouts of the five boroughs, were present as the 400 pound shipment was loaded aboard the plane.  
 More than 300 dolls were included after the girl scouts wanted to send "something special" to children who have never had any toys of their own.  
 The scouts, who have sent almost 1000 pounds of clothing to children in Greece, France, Italy, Germany and the Philippines, designed and sewed clothes for the dolls.

**ASTORIA BOOKIE CONFESSES TO 2 CHARGES IN WEEK**  
 Admitting two charges of bookmaking, William McDermott, 33, of 21-27 33rd street, Astoria, today was awaiting sentence next Monday in Manhattan Special Sessions. He was arrested twice within one week. The first time was Aug. 28 and on Sept. 3 he was taken into custody again at 120 East 41st street.  
 A second Astoria man, Joseph McGinty of 30-63 33rd street, will be sentenced Dec. 21 on a similar charge.  
 He confessed taking bets at 367 8th Avenue, Manhattan.

**MOTORIST HELD IN BOY'S DEATH**  
 Charged with auto homicide in the death of a 16-year-old Maspeth youth, Edmund W. Edwards, 21, of 91-21 82nd street, Woodhaven, was held for Grand Jury action after an examination before Magistrate Joseph B. Glebocki in Kew Gardens Vehicle Homicide Court.  
 Struck by an auto driven by Edwards on Aug. 10 at Beach Channel drive and Beach 96th street in Rockaway Beach, John Jones of 32-18 71st street died a week later in Rockaway Beach Hospital from a fractured skull and leg.  
 Detective George Kanegiser of the Queens Vehicle Homicide Squad testified that the 1929 Ford which Edwards was driving had no foot brakes or horn.  
 In holding Edwards for the Grand Jury, Magistrate Glebocki said:  
 "A law should be passed in this state to bar from the highways automobiles which can not pass a rigid mechanical inspection. There are too many jalopies on the road today."  
 Edwards told police that Jones was hitchhiking and stepped into the street to talk with a motorist, who stopped his car in the center of Beach Channel drive.  
 He said he attempted to pass around the halted auto, and as he did, Jones suddenly ran toward the curb in the path of Edwards' car.  
 Edwards admitted he saw Jones when he was 40 feet from him but was unable to stop his car.

**Thief Vows to Repay \$109; His Sentence Suspended**  
 A Maspeth bookkeeper found guilty of stealing from his employer today was on probation after he received a suspended sentence on his promise to make restitution.  
 Edward Dempsey, 41, of 57-33 65th street, was freed by Judge John A. Mulvan in Manhattan General Sessions. He was arrested for stealing \$109 from his company.
