Columbia Distribs Set Big Coast Promo For O'Hara "Irish" Album

HOLLYWOOD—A big dealer-deejay promotion has been kicked-off by the Columbia label's distributor on behalf of a new LP, "Maureen O'Hara Sings Her Favorite Irish Songs," timed for St. Patrick's Day.

About 30 full-scale window displays have been placed with dealers in Los Angeles, San Francisco, San Diego, San Bernardino, Bakersfield, Seattle and Phoenix. In addition to noting the album, each display contains a series of flick stills highlighting the performer's past and current films.

Along with the dealer tie-in, a concentrated push for coast airplay and several special radio promotions have been set up for the next three weeks by Bob Murphy, Columbia's regional promotion manager in the western area. Also, the star is scheduled for deejay appearances in the various cities where the window displays are showing.

The LP, produced by Irving Townsend and Teo Macero, contains repertoire chosen personally by the actress and features a collection of authentic Irish songs not generally known in this country.

N.Y. Publisher Arrested On Bribe Attempt

NEW YORK—Alan Kallman, a New York music publisher, has been arrested here on charges of attempting to bribe a member of the staff of an accounting firm which makes air-checks for BMI.

Kallman was arrested on Friday, Feb. 18, after the staff member, Stanley Levitz, told his superiors at Ernst & Ernst, the accounting firm, that Kallman had told him that advance information on which of the 100 stations the firm would check in a given month might be worth up to \$50,000 a year.

Levitz's superiors reported Kallman's alleged remarks to Levitz to the office of District Attorney Frank S. Hogan.

Kallman, whose publishing firm is called Alan K Music, pleaded not guilty in Special Sessions Court and was paroled pending trial by Chief Justice John M. Murtagh.

BMI employs the accounting firm to make monthly air-checks in order to obtain a projected national figure for the exposure of recordings, from which BMI makes royalty payments to writers and publishers.

Advance knowledge of stations to be monitored, it was noted by the prosecutor, Assistant District Attorney Jerome Kidder, could lead to arrangements, via payola, whereby the stations involved would offer more exposure for a certain disk. Thus, by inflating the national figure, a greater royalty payment would be made by BMI.

Cash Grows As Campus Draw

HOLLYWOOD—Johnny Cash, Columbia's star country-pop songster, will headline "The Roundup," final and largest campus event held each year in Austin by the University of Texas, a sign of his growing popularity among college audiences.

Students from surrounding colleges will also comprise the huge stand-up audience on Friday, April 6, in front of the school's main building where an authentic western town is to be recreated as a stage prop for Cash's appearance.

Over 25,000 students are expected to attend the affair.

Following the event, Cash is being set for an increased number of campus dates throughout 1962-63.

Lois Van Dwyne Named Promo Head Of Kramer Firm

NEW YORK—Miss Lois Van Dwyne has left her post as production director of Seven Arts Record Productions Corp., this city, and has joined Gary Kramer's Jubilee Artists Corp. as director of public relations.

Miss Dwyne, who in private life is the wife of music man Morty Craft, will also establish a jazz and pop department for the firm, which now specializes in gospel talent.

Prior to her association with Seven Arts, Miss Van Dwyne held a five year post with MGM Records.

ASCAP's McNamara Dies

NEW YORK—Daniel I. McNamara, editor of the ASCAP Biographical Dictionary, died last week (20) at the Mary Manning Walsh Home in New York City. McNamara was 76 years of age, and served the performing right society for 21 years.

Born in Trumbull, Connecticut, on October 23, 1885, he was educated in private schools in New Milford and Brookfield, Connecticut, and was graduated from the Danbury High School. In 1908-09 he was general press representative and private secretary to the late S. Z. Poli of the New England circuit of theatres. In 1914, he served as managing editor of the Bridgeport, Connecticut, "Evening Farmer," one of America's oldest newspapers.

Before joining ASCAP in 1937, McNamara served as promotion manager of King Features Syndicate.

Married to the late Anne S. Ring of Washington, D.C., Mr. McNamara is survived by his three sons, Daniel, Lawrence and John Michael.

A Requiem Mass was said at St. Ignatius Loyola Church in Manhattan last Friday (23). The body will repose at Campbell Funeral Home, also in Manhattan, after 7 PM Wednesday (28).
