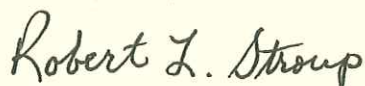

Ladies Ministries in turn supports Mother's Memorial, sponsors \$3,000.00 to UPCI Bible School scholarships yearly, and helps support District and camp functions. Your purposeful backing is appreciated and carefully appropriated.

Jr. Quizzing

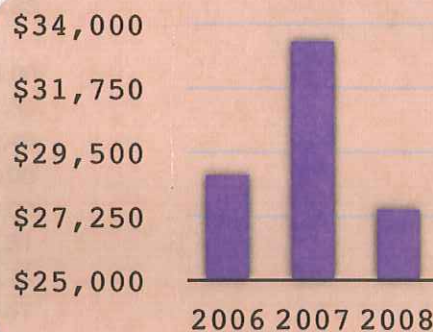
