# **3 dead after vehicle capsizes**



On Monday morning, 29 January Monday KwaZulu Private Ambulance Service responded to the N11 near the Chelmsford Dam junction, Newcastle, for reports of a collision. When emergency services arrived, they found that a bakkie had lost control and overturned.

Paramedics assessed the scene and found that one patient sustained serious injuries. The patient was treated on scene and then taken to hospital.

Three other occupants sustained fatal injuries and succumbed to their injuries before emergency services arrived.

# **Hijacking numbers down** over festive season, survey

target victims at, or close to, their residences and/or places of work," said Bartmann. "A recent trend was identified in which the hijackers kidnapped the victims to assist with the location of the tracking device and to delay the reporting of the incident. He confirmed that about thirty percent of all stolen and hijacked vehicles were taken across the border into neighbouring countries. He advised the public to always be aware of their surroundings and look out for any vehicles that may follow them. "If they suspect that they are being followed, they should drive to the closest police station immediately or at least to a busy centre where there are other people around.

"Do not offer any resistance during a hijacking. Remember that perpetrators are always armed and would not hesitate to fire when confronted. Additional perpetrators may stand out of view and fire should you fight back. A hijacking can happen at any place and at any time. The best response is to be alert and aware of any suspicious activity near you," said Bartmann

# sweeps through Newcastle

Ahead of the 2024 make-or-break national elections, political parties in Newcastle have given a new meaning to coalition elections.

The ruling Inkatha Freedom Party says it will not field a candidate in Wednesday's by-election, and will rather see the northern KZN town's deputy mayor have a go at the polls in line with a coalition agreement. The issue became heated in a bittersweet tussle for power-sharing. IFP mayor, Xolani Dube, has confirmed that the IFP will not field a candidate in the race to win the Ward 31 seat.

Instead, the IFP has now thrown its weight and colours behind supporting its coalition partner,

Team Sugar SA, will be lobbying votes for the TSSA led by deputy mayor, Musa Shukela Thwala. The IFP pulled out of the by-elections to leave the ward open for its coalition partner in the local council.

The deal-making came after the TSSA threatened out of coalition with the IFP.

A collapse of the coalition would leave the way clear for the ANC which was ousted from power in 2021 - to regain political control of the council.

Ahead of the local polls, the IFP leads with 18 seats, ANC-22, EFF-8, TSSA-6, DA-5, ActionSA-3 and the NFP, PA and ATM each have one seat.

# **Mayor condemns vandalism of** water infrastructure that deprives residents of right to services

The mayor of Amajuba District Municipality, Ndubako Zulu, has strongly condemned vandalism of the water infrastructure supplying this basic service to the eMadlangeni and Dannhauser areas. Zulu said that these acts undermine and disrupt the municipality's efforts to ensure water security to communities needing their services.

"Over the past months, we have witnessed several criminal acts and incidents in most of our plants whereby irresponsible and uncaring criminals stole cables and destroyed one of the most important component areas of the infrastructure.

"The recent incident, which has been handed over to SAPS, took place at the Utrecht Water Treatment Plant whereby criminals forcefully entered our plant, held our staff and security personnel at gunpoint, tortured them and helped themselves to copper cables that were meant for the upgrade and refurbishment of this plant.

destroying the water infrastructure and stealing of cables. The recent abuse and torture of our employees and security guards rendering their service through our contracted service provider goes beyond cruelty.

"Vandalism takes the municipality back in its service delivery plans and targets. As soon as water infrastructure is damaged, the municipality must make necessary and urgent steps to restore water supply and that is not accommodated in our budget. We cannot also exhaust our alreadystrained budget into unrealistic security measures just because of people who do not care," said a disappointed Zulu.

He cautioned residents that the ongoing water challenges will not be resolved if "uncaring crooks" make the water plants their playground, where they come to steal and destroy whenever their criminality needs to be catered for.

"We call upon our communities to close all corners for criminals whose acts seek to cause water production and supply disturbances.

# Football's flags fly at half-mast over deaths of fallen legends

Scores of iconic sportsmen, sportswomen and officials have brought a nation to a standstill with their breathtakingly stellar performances on the field of play. Among this pantheon of legends was world-class footballer, Bernard Hartze, blackballed by apartheid, the soccer legend nicknamed Dancing Shoes swerved around his obstacles and hit countless hat-tricks to succeed in his colourful career.

He died recently, aged 73, but not without a fan following of glowing tributes from the soccer el-supremo of FIFA, Kaizer Chiefs and Orlando Pirates, and peers like Ralph Hendricks and Vincent Pillay of Verulam Suburbs and Smiley Moosa.

Social media buzz shifted into overdrive as tributes - even from the Merebank Football WhatsApp chatline - went into overdrive when SA Football Association confirmed the striking forward's death from his daughter, Candice. His death followed that of the passing away of best-known Berea FC manager, Don Mudaly's wife, Faith, long-time supporter of her salesman husband's skillful and shrewd management of some of the country's foremost footballers in the Federation Professional League (FPL) - including Capebased soccer recruits like Keith America and some epic cup finals in Durban. Streams of mourners at the St Anthony's Church on last Friday, within the landmark Warwick Avenue Triangle - the home of Currie's Fountain Stadium where the couple gave off their time for football - learnt that Faith Mudaly was a "loving soul who cared for all and sundry... a tower of strength during their trials and tribulations."

The world of broadcasting took a knock when one of SABC's pioneering presenters, Adrian Stead, finally went off the airwaves. Ex-SABC presenter, Ashraf Garda, paid tribute to the veteran broadcaster on Facebook. Hartze's death drew local, national and global responses. Speaking from Robertsham, Johannesburg, Ralph Hendricks, football legend and former educator who retired 15 years ago as a principal and recipient of the Gauteng Legend Award, said: "Bernard Hartze was always concerned about his health and physical fitness ...a teetotaller who never smoked. His whole life was football, always training a few times a day ... a likeable, modest man who never spoke about his personal achievements.'

Equally in the same league like Hendricks, a midfield general who was recruited at Verulam Suburbs by manager, Balu Parekh, in the 1970s, former Orlando Pirates teammate, Smiley Moosa, ranked Hartze highly, saying he was "an exceptionally talented forward striker, one of most outstanding players and was powerfully built ... the best dribblers who scored goals with both feet.

Despite his fame on the field, Hartze battled the odds of separate residential zones for Coloured, Indian and African people. Born in enriched our lives."

Marabastad to mixed-race parents on 5 March 1950, an apartheid section of Pretoria, he was classified Coloured. From the ghettoes, this teenage wonder rose spectacularly above the social handicaps and waltzed into top-notched national teams before displaying his dancelike dribbling skills with SA glamour clubs and Tampa Bay Rowdies in the USA. I witnessed his sheer magic with the ball on the field and will always remember his nifty footwork and charm on the dance floor at the Miss FPL beauty pageant preceding cup finals at the Pelican Hotel in Chatsworth in the 1970s, then a big star at Cape Town Spurs. Over and above from receiving the highest

tribute from Gianni Infantine, president of the world soccer authority, FIFA, and many officials and ex-teammates, the Durban delegate of his first team, Sundown's, Steven Govender paid this tribute: "Hartze was a dazzling star in the 1970s. What a sensation when he played for Cape Town Spurs. He could have walked in to top UK Premier League clubs."

His unique trademark, which earned him the Dancing Shoes image, was his deft dribbling skills and fancy footwork, swerving his body with the ball and sending opponents the wrong away around and shooting for goals, massing moré than 50 in one season.

Dancing Shoes was in a class of his own he literally danced around the ball and mesmerised hard-tackling defenders who fell the other way as he propelled his athletic body towards ramming home the ball into the goal posts - so much so the White-only clubs attempted to declassify him and re-register him as a privileged citizen, like the way Mayfair Rangers recruited Percy Owen. At 17, he was the most sensational and spirited player. UK giants Leeds United gave him trials, but tough immigration rules, work permits, plus homesickness scuppered his dreams. However, before that Germiston-born Albert Johannsen became the first player of colour

in for Leeds' 1965 FA Cup Final. Pat Pillai, among the first batch of broadcasters of colour to make it on SABC TV, said Adrian Steed's untimely departure "leaves a void in the entertainment industry ... his legacy as a consummate professional and a genuinely kind soul will continue to inspire those in the industry for years to come ... bid farewell to a talent that illuminated our screens and



# **KZN Legislature ECD** oversights an eye-opener as funding crisis hits hard

School functionality oversights, as part of the KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) Legislature programme, have revealed an ongoing funding crisis when it comes to Early Childhood Development (ECD) in the province. This, as numerous facilities visited by MPLs were found to be facing similar challenges including a severe lack of funding for food, with children at Madiba creche in uThukela not being fed since the start of the school year.

Further issues include being unable to pay educator salaries, carrying out maintenance and being unable to pay utility bills. At some centres MPLs also found that toys were broken, mattresses were old and dirty and - at Thuthukani crèche in uThukela - we discovered a single, unsafe pit toilet for 38 little learners.

The situation is largely the result of ECDs being the victims of a poorly managed function shift from KZN's Department of Social Development (DSD) to the province's Department of Education (DoE). This took place without sector funding automatically moving with it. The result is that some ECDs are only paid every three months, leaving them in a helpless position that has contributed to a never-ending vicious cycle.

This while education district officials blame head-office for non-payments, leaving ECDs nowhere to turn to. Many parents who send their children to ECDs are unemployed and cannot afford to pay fees. This leaves many centres without any other form of income and completely dependent on government funding

The DA commends the many ECD educators and staff who are doing their best

under extremely trying conditions. Unfortunately, they are being let down by an ANC-run government that does not have their best interests at heart.

This week's oversights - and the DA's own recent interactions with some 30 KZN ECD principals - has confirmed that the DoE is vet to find its feet when it comes to this important sector. This to the detriment of millions of young learners.

The DA has made several suggestions with regard to improving conditions within KZN's ECDs. These include:

Ensuring that learners are fed through the National Schools Nutrition Programme (NSNP) – an appeal that has fallen on deaf ears;

• Reducing the amount of paperwork and bureaucracy that exists, which is creating yet another stumbling block for ECDs and preventing them from being paid on time, and:

. 2 medium sweet potatoes peeled and cubed

- . 1/4 cup milk
- . 1 cup all purpose or cake flour
- . 1 cup wholewheat flour
- . 1 tsp salt
- . 2/3 cup coconut oil soft but not melted
- 5 tbsp cold water
- 2 cup beef mince
- . 1/3 cup red onion chopped
- 1 tbsp chutney mild
- . 2 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- . 1/3 cup frozen peas
- . 1/3 cup carrot chopped
- . 1/3 cup white mushrooms sliced

### Cook

Preheat the oven to 160°C fan/180°C.

Add the potato to a pan of boiling water and cook for 10-15 minutes,

until tender. Drain and mash with the milk, then set aside. Using a pastry blender or food processor, combine the flours, salt and coconut oil.

The coconut oil should be soft, but not melted. Add 1 tbsp at a time of cold water, until the dough comes together.

Lightly grease a muffin pan. Shape the dough into 12 balls, then roll out each one and press into a well of the muffin pan.

Place a large frying pan or skillet over a medium heat and add the beef.

Using a wooden spoon, break the meat into little pieces. Add the onion and salt, then cook for a further 3 minutes.

Add the chutney, Worcestershire

sauce, peas, carrot and mushroom. Stir and allow to cook until the beef is cooked through.

Distribute the meat filling among the pastry cases (shells), then top with the mashed potato.

Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes. Leave to cool for 5 minutes in the muffin pan before removing to serve.

1. The pies won't rise, so you can pile them up. They may actually sink a little


