

#### Swift arrest

Detectives tracked down and arrested two brothers within 24 hours after they allegedly attacked a trio of Riverdale youths here, wounding one with a hatchet and a hammer.

When Detectives Vic Cipullo and Vic Cruz traced the plate number the victims gave them, they found the car was registered to a 60-year-old Yonkers resident. Realizing he couldn't have been the culprit, they checked phone directories for others with the same last name, and narrowed their search to four Bronx neighborhoods. They found the car parked at 207 St. and Parkside Place.

The detectives staked out the car the evening of June 23 until a youth who fit the description of one of the attackers appeared. Questioning of the suspect led the detectives to the second suspect, his brother.

A search of the car uncovered a ballpeen hammer. The hatchet used in the attack, had already been recovered near the site of the assault.


