**Smart mark**

Two con artists picked on the wrong mark last week and were caught with their phony pack of bills. The would-be victim told police two women came up to her on the street near her Marble Hill apartment last Thursday morning.

They spun the old tale of "having found a green bank bag chock full of cash, \$150,000." They offered to share the bonanza with the resident if she would put up some money of her own to help pay the taxes on the loot.

The pair went to the woman's apartment, while she fetched her bank book. They put a number of "bundles of cash," her third of the "found money," into her closet before they headed with her to the bank.

The cons waited outside North Side Savings while the mark went inside. While the woman prepared to withdraw the \$3,000 the cons said was needed, she began to have doubts. She told the teller her story and the bank manager called the cops.

Detectives responded to the bank and interviewed the woman. She gave them a description of the pair and of their car. Anti Crime Officers Tom Casey and Jim Keating searched the area and found two women who fit the description.

Following the victim's identification, police charged Laverne Long, 35, of 345 E. 145 St., and Odessa Crump, 33, of 20 Richmond Plaza, Staten Island, with attempted grand larceny and fraudulent accosting.

**Swift arrest**

Detectives tracked down and arrested two brothers within 24 hours after they allegedly attacked a trio of Riverdale youths here, wounding one with a hatchet and a hammer.

When Detectives Vic Cipullo and Vic Cruz traced the plate number the victims gave them, they found the car was registered to a 60-year-old Yonkers resident. Realizing he couldn't have been the culprit, they checked phone directories for others with the same last name, and narrowed their search to four Bronx neighborhoods. They found the car parked at 207 St. and Parkside Place.

The detectives staked out the car the evening of June 23 until a youth who fit the description of one of the attackers appeared. Questioning of the suspect led the detectives to the second suspect, his brother.

A search of the car uncovered a ballpeen hammer. The hatchet used in the attack, had already been recovered near the site of the assault.

Det. Cipullo arrested Manuel Balaj, 26, and Gjon

Balaj, 23, both of 3235 Parkside Place, following a lineup where they were picked out by the victims. They face charges of assault and criminal possession of a dangerous weapon.

The three Riverdalians, in their 20's, got into an argument with the two suspects who arrived on the scene on June 22, while they were talking to three young women. One word led to another and the new arrivals kicked the door of the residents' car, breaking a window.

The pair drove off, and the Riverdalians followed them to Post Road where the argument continued. The two assailants allegedly attacked the three. One of the victims was severely cut on the left wrist and right arm. Another was punched in the eye.

**12 years for burglary/robbery**

A 30-year-old Bronx man who terrified a senior citizen last year when she woke to find him in her bedroom won't be creeping into apartments in the early hours for some time. Richard Ferrugia of 1580

Edison Ave. drew six to 12 years recently for his burglary/robbery caper.

The elderly resident of 750 Kappock St told Det. Larry Adams of the Bronx Senior Citizens Robbery Unit that she woke at 5:30 a.m. June 28, 1983, to find a six-footer lurking in the room. The man ordered her not to move, promising he wouldn't hurt her.

He tied her with tape and a phone cord, then kept asking, "Where's the money?" He found a suitcase in the closet, filled it with about \$25,000 worth of jewelry and a small amount of cash and fled.

Det. Adams discovered the burglar had climbed down from the roof using a rope. He landed on the apartment terrace, then crept in through the bathroom window. The man worked for a firm that was repairing the building.

Mr. Ferrugia pled guilty in May to burglary, robbery and grand larceny. Justice Eugene Nardelli handed down the sentence on June 15.


