**New Express Bus Services Are Readied**

The success of the pioneer Riverdale Express bus service to mid-Manhattan has led to the launching of similar routes in the Bronx.

The Board of Estimate will consider a resolution today to grant final approval for an express bus service between Co-Op City and Manhattan. A resolution in favor of the franchise was presented by Bronx Borough President Robert Abrams.

The express buses to be operated by New York Bus Service, Inc., are expected to begin operation on Jan. 15, 1971. Mr. Abrams also announced that a petition to operate an express bus service between the Pelham Parkway section and midtown Manhattan will be filed by the same company. New York Bus Service, headed by Edward Arrigoni, president, now runs the successful express bus service between Parkchester and midtown Manhattan.
