





I. CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

August 9, 2013

- The Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) located at 1,150 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "LABUYO". It intensified and accelerated as it moved in a northwest direction with maximum sustained winds ranged from 45-55 kph near the center.

August 10, 2013

- Tropical Storm (TS) "LABUYO" has intensified as it continued to move west northwest in the general direction of Northern Luzon. It has intensified further as it continued to threaten Northern and Central Luzon. TS "LABUYO" intensified further into a **TYPHOON** with maximum sustained winds ranged from 85 to 120 kph near the center and gustiness of 100 to 150 kph.



August 11, 2013

- Typhoon "LABUYO" continued to move closer to the Aurora Province with maximum sustained winds of 140 kph to 165 kph near the center and gustiness of 150 -200 kph.

August 12, 2013

- Typhoon "LABUYO" made its landfall over Casiguran, Aurora early in the morning, it weakened while crossing Northern Luzon and it exited the Philippine landmass in the afternoon with maximum sustained winds ranged from 165 - 175 kph near the center and gustiness from 185- 210 kph

II. EFFECTS

A. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)

- A total of six (6) incidents were monitored during TY Labuyo: one (1) drowning, one (1) rockslide, three (3) flashfloods, and one (1) storm surge

B. CASUALTIES (TAB B) *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- The total number of casualties is **21**

Dead: 10 (1 in Benguet; 1 in Dupax del Sur, Nueva Vizcaya; 2 in Boljoon, Cebu; 1 in Infanta, Quezon; 1 in Casiguran, Aurora; 1 in San Agustin, Isabela; 1 in Dingalan, Aurora, and **2 in Pangasinan**)

Injured: 7 (3 in Ifugao, 3 in Baguio City, and 1 in Sta. Cruz, Zambales)

Missing: 4 (1 in Batanes, 2 in Camarines Norte, and 1 in Sta. Barbara, Pangasinan)

C. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB C) *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- A total of **86,295 families or 398,813 persons** were affected in **678 barangays** in **87 municipalities** and **7 cities** in **16 provinces** of Regions I, II, III, V and CAR
- Per latest report of DSWD, all established evacuation centers have been closed and only 24,605 families / 112,357 persons are staying with either relatives or friends**

D. STRANDEES *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- Twenty-five (25)** passengers and **1** vessel in North Eastern Luzon are still stranded

E. STATUS OF LIFELINES (TAB D) *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- Fifteen (15) roads (1 in Region I, 1 in Region II, 2 in Region III, and 11 in CAR) are still impassable due to floodwaters except Kayapa –Nueva Vizcaya Road, Bongabon Baler Road, Baler–Casiguran Road, Dinadlawan-Madela Road, and Brgy Dinadlawan Dipaculao Aurora Road which are due to rock slide, landslide and/or soil collapsed. Clearing operations are still on going
- One (1) bridge in Isabela Province (Region II) is still rendered impassable while all bridges in Region III are now passable
- Power outages are still being experienced in Barangays Baloganon, Collat, Tapuac, Sta. Rita, and San Lorenzo of Masinloc, Zambales in Region III; and Ifugao, Kalinga, Mt Province and Baguio City in CAR. Power restoration is ongoing in Region III and CAR
- Communications in Dipaculao, Dinalungan and Casiguran, Aurora are still down due to damaged cell sites

F. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB E) *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- A total of **20,665 houses** were damaged (**2,565 totally / 18,090 partially**) in Regions I, II, III, V and CAR

G. COST OF DAMAGES (TAB F) *As of 5:00 PM, 16 August 2013*

- The total amount of damages incurred in Regions I, II, III and CAR is pegged at PhP1,084,144,361.59 (Infrastructures PhP358,547,941.93 and Agriculture PhP725,596,419.66)

- Floodings in previously reported areas have already subsided except in Barangay Bulawon, Sta. Cruz, Zambales.

III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

NDRRMC INITIATIVES

Upgraded NDRRMOC into an Emergency Operation Center (EOC) under **RED ALERT STATUS** effective 11 August 2013;

Disseminated Weather Bulletins and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal level;

Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibilities (AOR); and

Alerted NDRRMC member agencies for close coordination and monitoring with their respective local agencies in the affected Regions re preparedness /precautionary measures undertaken prior to the land fall of Labuyo and for monitoring of the situation and effects with their respective local agencies in the affected Regions and to report to NDRRMOC.

The OCD Administrator and Chief, NDRRMOC attended press conferences at PAGASA and regularly conducted personal interviews and press conferences with the media for any updates of the effects of Typhoon Labuyo and assessment of needs of the affected population.

NDRRMOC requested for assets from the AFP for the conduct of aerial SAR operations.

The OCD Administrator conducted area assessment to Aurora Province on 13 August 2013 on board AFP- PAF Plane to see the actual situation in Region III

NDRRMOC is still continuously monitoring the situation in the affected areas particularly the Aurora Province in Region III where Typhoon Labuyo made its landfall and the emergency relief and response efforts of various responders

SUMMARY OF RDRRMCS/PDRRMCS INITIATIVES

RDRRMCS I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VIII, NCR and CAR raised their respective Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Centers (RDRRMOCs) under Red Alert status; regularly disseminated weather/flood bulletins, weather advisories and gale warning to all concerned local DRRMCS, RDRRMCS member-agencies, tri-media and fisher folks association thru facsimile and SMS. Alerted their respective RDRRMCS member agencies and local DRRMCS affected to closely monitor the situation and possible effects of Typhoon Labuyo in their respective AOR and undertake pre-emptive measures; and uploaded advisories to OCD-RDRRMCS Facebook page to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero casualties.

PDRRMCS disseminated weather advisories to all M/BDRRMCS members; maintained 24 hour monitoring of the weather situation of respective areas; closely coordinated with response agencies for assistance in terms of search and rescue and relief operations; advised all LGUs to put their OpCen on alert status and prepositioned all their available SAR equipment and rescue groups on standby for immediate response and deployment; prepositioned food and non-food items for assistance to affected families; convened a meeting to discuss preparedness and response activities and responsibilities of each council member; deployed provincial rescue teams to flood prone areas; advised all low-lying barangays for necessary evacuation; and advised fishermen to refrain from fishing.
