CLUB HISTORY

Gedling Miners Welfare FC was formed in 1919, at the same time as the Notts Alliance Football league resumed playing football again after the First World War. In their first Season they finished 3rd in the League and won the League Cup by defeating Sneinton FC 1 – 0.

At the end of the 1929-30 Season the Club changed its name and became known as Mapperley St. Judes and enjoyed moderate success during this period. During the Second World War we reformed as Gedling Miners Welfare FC and with the restart of football for the 1945-46 Season we went on to win both the Notts Alliance League and Notts Alliance Senior Cup. This was repeated on numerous occasions and this success spilled over into the 1950s, which was the most successful period of the Club. We won the Notts Alliance League and Cup Double many times and at one point remained unbeaten for three Seasons.

In the FA Amateur Cup we entertained two of the top sides of the time. Pegasus were the visitors to Plains Road in 1954 and temporary stands were erected all around the Ground to house a crowd of 7,000 plus. Two Seasons later Bishop Auckland visited and the Police put a limit of 10,000 on the Gate. We lost 4 – 1 to the best amateur team in the country, having missed a penalty at a crucial point in the game. The 'Bishops' had six amateur England Internationals on show and the most famous being Bob Hardisty who was the Captain of England. The staggering record attendance at Plains Road, will surely never again be surpassed by a Nottinghamshire amateur club.

So we are all looking forward to a successful campaign under Andy Clerke who is forging a squad capable of competing at the top end of this level. This is a period of growth at Gedling and we are confident that Clerke and his team will deliver. They will be backed up by the Committee and everyone at the Club to produce a team that we can all be proud of.

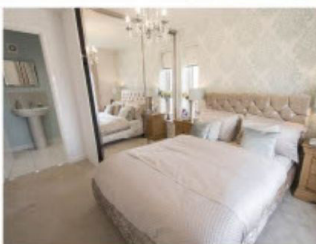

MATCH REPORT

ST ANDREWS 2
GEDLING MW 2

Liam Corrigan's stoppage time header rescued a point for Gedling Miners Welfare in their league match away at St Andrews last Saturday.

Having trailed 2-0 until the 85th minute, it took a late show of character and determination from the Miners to pull off a stunning late comeback to earn a point, with Ruben Wiggins-Thomas netting before Corrigan's heroics.

In truth Gedling had much of the play and should arguably have been out of site in the first half if they had produced more clinical finishing. However, their failure to do so was capitalised on by the hosts who amassed a two goal cushion and looked on course for all three points until the late drama unfolded in a very watchable game.

In a cagey opening it was Gedling who came the closest to breaking the deadlock early on. Lloyd Patterson's looping cross in the fourth minute, seemed harmless enough but somehow deceived the goalkeeper and hit the top of the bar before bouncing away.

Then came one of the most contentious moments of the half. Josh Thornton's free kick from the left wing bypassed the players queuing in the middle for it and flew all the way into the net. However, the assistant spotted an infringement and raised his flag. It seemed harsh to deem that any of the Gedling attackers were interfering with play as none of them were anywhere near getting on the end of the delivery but the referee backed his assistant and waved away the visitors' protestations.

Gedling were undeterred and kept pressing. Five minutes later, Greg Tempest's corner caused the 'keeper some issues and the ball fell to Wiggins-Thomas with the goal seemingly at his mercy. Uncharacteristically, he didn't get the finish right and hooked the ball over the crossbar.

Niall Hylton was the next Gedling attacker to go close. A mistake at the back from the hosts presented him with the ball and he burst into the box. His shot was well saved by the 'keeper but there were loud appeals for a penalty as it looked like Hylton had been clipped as he was in the process of taking his shot. The referee was unmoved and play continued.

With ten minutes of the half remaining, St Andrews were awarded a penalty. A shot was fired in and smashed the arm of Paolo Piliero from almost point blank range. The referee had no hesitation in giving the penalty for handball but it looked an incredibly harsh decision.

Ben Law dispatched the penalty with extreme calmness to give the hosts the lead against the run of play.

Gedling almost produced an instant response as Piliero crossed the ball in from the left wing and found Patterson, however the defender couldn't keep his shot down and the chance went begging.

This meant St Andrews left the field at half time, a goal to the good.

At the start of the second half it was one way traffic as Gedling bossed possession but couldn't quite find the final pass to unlock the hosts' stubborn defence.

On the hour mark, a piercing pass from Ross McCaughey played Greg Tempest through on goal. He tried to lob the goalkeeper but the ball drifted wide of the target.

Just a few minutes later, the hosts made Gedling pay for not being able to draw level by doubling their advantage. Curtis Boddy was unmarked at a corner and took full advantage to nod the ball home.

Gedling 'keeper Matthew Simpson then produced a smart stop to save a shot from distance and keep Gedling in the match.

To their credit Gedling kept going forward. Tempest again made a good run and was played in on goal by Corrigan. However, the 'keeper was quickly off his line to meet him and blocked the shot.

With time ebbing away, Gedling got the goal that their hard work, craft and resilience warranted. Corrigan drove forward out of defence and clipped a dangerous looking ball into the box. Wiggins-Thomas headed it on and chased after it, capitalising on the keeper's hesitance, he deftly slipped the ball past him as he tried to narrow the angle. As the ball nestled into the net it was clear that there would be a grandstand finish.

With virtually the last kick of the game, Tempest swung in a delightful corner and Corrigan rose highest to meet it with a thundering header which flew into the back of the net and ensured the teams would share the spoils.

Clifton All Whites FC is probably amongst the most recognisable amateur football clubs in the county due to some of its more famous past youth team players going on to play at the higher levels of football in this country both domestically and internationally, and for the infamous 'All Whites' nickname which caused controversy amongst some quarters in the mid 90s led to the official scrapping of the tag which has now and quite rightly so been reinstated.

Player such as Gary Birtles, Jermaine Pennent, Darren Huckerby, Jermaine Jenas, Michael Johnson to name a few have all come through the clubs youth structure over the past years. Clifton All Whites have also been successful on the pitch, formerly playing in the Midland League and Notts Alliance the club also reached the third round of the FA Vase in 1975/76 and winning the Senior League cup in 2006, a year later the reserves won their first NSL honour gaining the first division Championship under the guidance of James Turner and Chris Driffill and in 2010 the same management team took the clubs first team and delivered the Notts Senior League senior league title for the first time in the clubs history.

Again in 2013/14 Turner and Driffill along with the senior team took the CMFL South division title but controversially and unfortunately due to ground grading issues All Whites were denied promotion to the EMCFL.

The club rallied round and in 2016/17 won the Notts Senior League Title and this time gained the promotion they

deserved to the East Midlands Counties Football League.

On the back of this success the development of the Green Lane ground has been raised and with the support of the current chairman we hope to carry on to another level.
