EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Alcohol & Drugs

Eight week program designed to identify and address challenges of addiction utilizing the twelve steps of spiritual principles.

Creative Arts

Designed to teach the importance of being creative and its therapeutic benefits.

Domestic Violence Awareness

Six week program designed to help victims with the scope and impact of domestic violence on individuals and society.

E-Law Library Training

Educational class on Westlaw and Lexis Nexis legal software to gain knowledge/ conduct legal research.

Final Escape

Eight week program designed to help ex-offenders get out and stay out of prison through understanding the true meaning of authentic love as designed by the creator.

Hi-Set-GED

Designed to provide opportunities for residents to earn a GED, build self-worth and personal value and increase opportunities for post-incarceration employment..

Life Skills

Twelve week program designed to increase self-esteem, build social skills, develop family readiness skills and decrease the likelihood of recidivism and successful living.

Residents have an opportunity to voice their concerns an opinions on current events and other topics

REHABILITATIVE PROGRAMS

Chaplain Services

Facility chaplains , and volunteers plan, lead, administer and coordinate religious activities and develop community resources to meet the religious needs of incarcerated offenders.

Authentic Manhood 33 Series

The program covers a multi-volume series that begins with meaningful insights into the current state of manhood.

Inside Out Dad (Fatherhood Initiative)

Evidenced based program dedicated to educating and engaging fathers in child development,

Moral Reconation Therapy (MRT)

Certified counselors facilitate weekly group sessions that address the nine personality stages of anticipated growth and recovery to improve clients' reasoning levels.

Thinking For A Change 4.0

Eight to twelve weeks evidenced-based cognitive behavioral change program that assist from cognitive restructuring theory, social skill development and the learning and use of problem solving skills.

Religious Services

Religious leaders recognize the critical role spiritual well being and religion play in helping people build moral lives of character and cope with the stress of incarceration and their preparation for release.
