

HONOR CROSS TO KREIBOHM

**Captain Again Decorated for Saving
89 in Volturno Disaster.**

Captain Paul H. Kreibohm, formerly commander of the Red Star steamship Kroonland, trading between New York and Antwerp, received the American Cross of Honor yesterday in the offices of Congressman Henry Bruckner, 410 East 161st Street, the Bronx.

The Congressman explained that the decoration had been awarded to Captain Kreibohm for rescuing eighty-nine passengers from the steamship Volturno when she was destroyed by fire at sea on Oct. 9, 1913. The Kroonland arrived on the scene at 9 o'clock at night, when the Volturno was alight fore and aft, and there was a heavy sea running, which made the work of saving her passengers both difficult and dangerous.

The Captain has received several medals for his action in the Volturno disaster, including the Order of the Belgian Crown, which was awarded to him by King Albert.
