

# GILHOOLEY HERE AGAIN.

## Boy Stowaway on Kroonland in Fourth Attempt to Enter Country.

Michael Gilhooley, the 15-year-old stowaway who had already made three attempts to enter the United States and had been deported each time as an alien liable to become a public charge, arrived again yesterday on board the transport Kroonland. He was taken to Ellis Island, and will be sent back to France.

The persevering youth is not at all daunted at his ill-luck, and told the inspectors that he would get into America some day if he lived long enough. He says he has friends in the 60th Guard Company, which came on the Arcadia, and hopes they will get him through.

Gilhooley on his third attempt to enter the country stowed away on the President's ship, the George Washington. He was sent to Ellis Island, but escaped by floating across to the Jersey shore on a raft made of lifebelts lashed together. He was captured and returned to France again on the transport.

There were 1,532 officers and men on board the Kroonland. The transport Pocahontas arrived yesterday from the West with 380 army passengers and docked at Pier 3 Army Base, South Brooklyn. She was formerly the Prinzess Irene of the North German Lloyd, and will now be turned over to the Government by the Navy Department.
