AVCA All-Southeastern Region ... All-SEC Team ... Two-time SEC Offensive Player of the Week ... Member of the 2016 Preseason All-SEC Team ... Her 151 blocks ranks second in a single season during the 25-point rally scoring era ... Had a .362 attack percentage, the best during the 25-point rally scoring era and fifth-best in a single season in UK history ... Recorded 20 block solos, the second most during the 25-point rally scoring era ... Her 151 blocks led the team in 2016 and were the second most during the 25-point rally scoring era, trailing her 2015 performance ... Averaged 1.42 blocks per set, good for 15th in the nation and third best in the SEC ... Recorded 11 matches with 10 or more kills and 13 matches with five or more blocks ... Second on the team in kills at 273, averaging 2.58 kills per set ... Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week after recording a combined 25 kills against Georgia and Mississippi State ... Earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors after posting 11 kills on just 14 swings for an .643 hitting percentage against Arkansas ... Recorded a season-high 17 kills with an .800 hitting

percentage against South Carolina ... Had two double-digit block matches, one against Virginia and one at Auburn ... Led the team in hitting percentage 13 times and blocks 16 times ... Notched nine kills on 17 swings in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Washington ... Earned 10 total blocks in the NCAA Tournament against Colorado State and Washington ... Added 11 digs and four assists during the 2016 campaign.

Ranked second on the team in total points with 406.0 ... Ranked second on the team with 306 kills ... Led team in kills in 10 matches ... Recorded 10 or more kills in 16 matches ... Posted a career-high 20 kills and added six blocks in season opener against Michigan State (8/28) ... First middle blocker to record a double-double since 2007 with a 10-kill, 13-block outing, guiding UK to a 3-1 win over Louisville (9/20), resulting in her first SEC Defensive Player of the Week honor ... Recorded second career double-double in regular season finale with 13 kills and 11 blocks against Auburn (11/27) ... Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week and Player of the Week following 18 kills on .400 hitting and 14 blocks in two sweeps of LSU (10/22) and Georgia (10/25) ... Bluegrass Battle MVP after 43 kills and 13 blocks in three matches to start the season (8/28-8/29) ... Added 12 digs and three assists on the season ... Led UK in blocks 13 times and posted five or more rejections on eight occasions ... In her NCAA Tournament debut, recorded a career-best 10 kills on .600 hitting with four blocks vs. Oakland ... Notched a career-high-tying eight kills with a team-best six blocks vs. Arkansas, her third consecutive match with at least seven kills ... 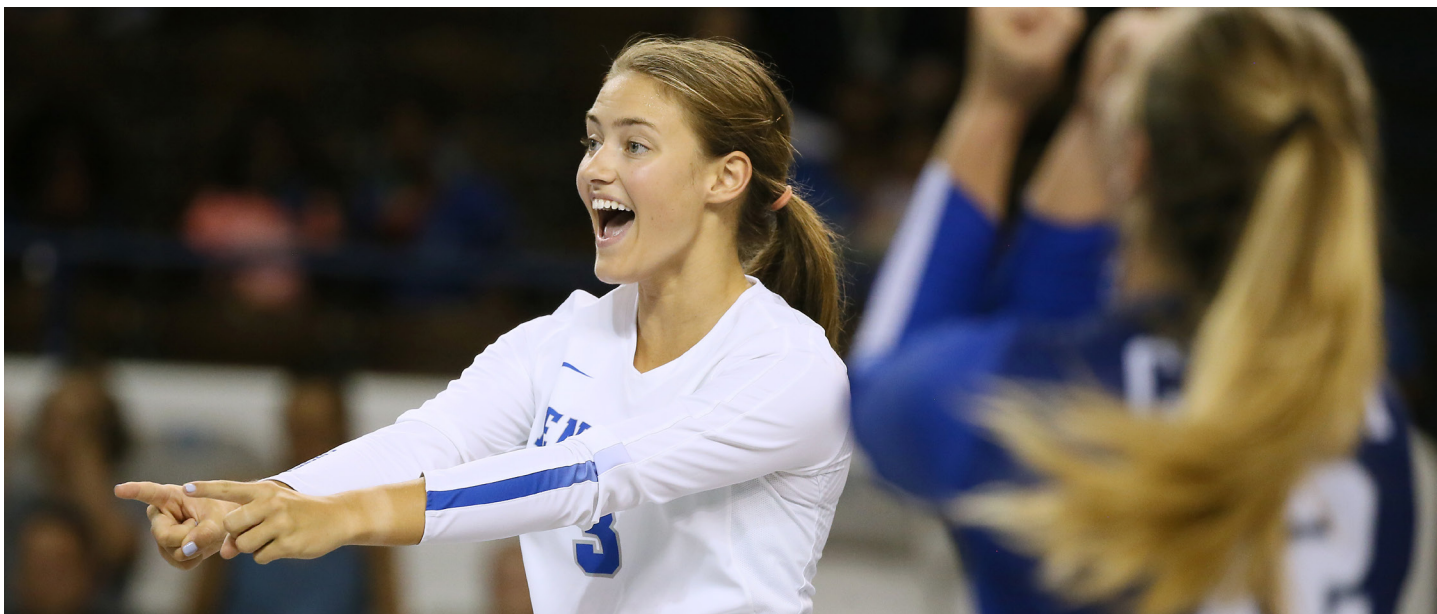

HEAD COACH • 13TH SEASON



Since being tabbed Kentucky's head coach in December 2004, Craig Skinner has rejuvenated the Kentucky volleyball program into national prominence en route to becoming the program's all-time winningest head coach. Skinner has directed the Wildcats to 12 consecutive NCAA Tournaments - a feat only nine other

schools in the nation have achieved. That run includes three Sweet Sixteen appearances since 2009. Furthermore, the Wildcats have captured 17 or more victories in all 12 seasons under Skinner's direction, including tallying 20 or more wins in nine of the last 10 seasons.

Following another record-breaking season in 2012, Skinner was rewarded with a new six-year contract keeping him at Kentucky until at least 2019.

In 2014, a 3-0 victory over Georgia Southern gave Skinner his 211th match as the head coach of the Wildcats to become the school's all-time leader in career wins. Now with an all-time record of 250-101, he passed former coach Kathy DeBoer who capped her career with 209-92.

Skinner became the fastest coach in school allure to total 100 career victories in just his fifth season, and is the only coach in program history to advance to postseason play in each season at the helm. In 2012, Skinner notched his 100th career Southeastern Conference victory.

Sixteen players have garnered 30 All-America distinctions, while UK has hauled in 45 All-Southeastern Conference honors in his 12 seasons - including the 2008 SEC Player of the Year, 2006 and 2016 SEC Freshman of the Year, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2016 SEC Libero of the Year, and the 2005 SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

The Wildcats have enjoyed unprecedented success which has included a school-record run of 47 consecutive weeks ranked in the top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association poll, record-breaking attendance marks and a eight-time host of NCAA Tournament play including serving as one of four host sites for the 2015, 2013 and 2011 NCAA Regionals.

Prior to Skinner's arrival, the Kentucky volleyball program had not experienced a winning season in the previous five years and had not made an NCAA Tournament appearance since the 1993 season.

In just one season in the Bluegrass, Skinner led the Wildcats to a 17-12 record and their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1993. For the team's accomplishments and quick turnaround, Skinner was named the 2005 SEC Coach of the Year.

In 2006, Kentucky posted a 19-12 record - its most wins since the 1993 campaign - and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after toppling No. 20 Ohio in the opening round. The Wildcats took perennial power Florida to five

games for the first time since 1988 and knocked off No. 18 Tennessee in Lexington. The win over the Lady Vols was significant as it marked the first time UK knocked off a ranked foe in 66 attempts dating back to Sept. 24, 1993.

Skinner in his third season then achieved something no other UK volleyball coach had ever done - he led his team to a third consecutive NCAA appearance after another improved season. The Wildcats went 22-10 and toppled another ranked opponent in No. 18 LSU on national television in Lexington on its way to a fourth place overall finish in the conference.

The Wildcats emerged as one of the best teams in the nation in 2008 reaching the AVCA national polls for 10 consecutive weeks, including finishing the year with a No. 22 overall ranking. Kentucky posted 26 victories, including a school-record 17 wins in the SEC. Skinner's squad finished second in the league standings, the best finish for the school since 1990. Included in that extraordinary conference run was a five-set upset victory over No. 12 Florida in front of the fifth-largest crowd ever to witness a volleyball match in Memorial Coliseum.

Additionally, the Wildcat program took another big step under Skinner's direction when Lexington was selected as a host site of the 2008 NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds. The selection solidified Kentucky as a program no longer on the rise - but, as one of the teams others will have to contend with for years to come.

Several Kentucky players achieved impressive honors, including junior Sarah Rumely who was named the 2008 SEC Player of the Year. With the honor she became the first player in UK history to win the award voted on by league coaches. Rumely and senior Queen Nzenwa were All-America honorees and led a record-breaking five UK players on All-SEC ballots.

The 2009 season signified the Wildcats had officially arrived on the national scene. The Blue and White opened the season rated as the No. 21 team in the country and remained in the polls during every week of the season en route to a 29-5 year and the first Sweet Sixteen appearance under Skinner's direction. UK was selected to host the First and Second Rounds of the national tournament for the second consecutive year, and the Wildcats knocked off the tournament's No. 13 seed in Oregon to advance to Regionals. UK soared up the polls and reached as high as No. 7 in the national rankings during the season.

The Wildcats finished second overall in the SEC and claimed the SEC East crown for the first time in

program history. For the fifth consecutive season, Skinner led the squad to more victories than the previous year. On Oct. 9, Skinner claimed his 100th career victory in Lexington with a 3-0 win over Auburn. Kentucky's fifth-year head coach reached the 100-win plateau faster than any other previous coach in the history of the program. In postseason recognition, Kentucky matched its record of five players named to the All-SEC squads with Rumely and junior Sarah Mendoza tabbed to the first-team. Senior BriAnne Sauer would team with the duo to claim a school-best three All-America distinctions. Rumely was a second-team selection, with Mendoza and Sauer named honorable mention honorees.

Although faced with a tough challenge of replacing three All-Americans from the previous season, the 2010 edition of the UK volleyball team continued its impressive streak of NCAA tournament runs. Kentucky capped its season with 17 victories for the sixth consecutive season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament yet again. Sophomore Stephanie Klefot headlined postseason accolades as she became the first player in school history to obtain SEC Libero of the Year honors, while Lauren Rapp earned All-America honorable mention honors.

The 2011 season saw the Wildcats back among the top-rated teams in the nation with UK capping a 28-6 season ranked No. 13 in the country and hosting the NCAA Regionals for the first time in program history. Led by Klefot, a second-team All-America selection, UK ventured on the road to College Station, Texas, and knocked off Dayton and the host-team Texas A&M Aggies to return to Lexington for its second appearance in the Regionals in the last three seasons. Kentucky went toe-to-toe with the tournament's No. 1 overall seed in Texas before the largest crowd in the Skinner era in Memorial Coliseum.

Klefot repeated as the SEC Libero of the Year and set a new-single season UK record with more than 600 digs. She also helped match a program-record with three All-America selections joined by junior Christine Hartmann and sophomore Whitney Billings. Billings became the youngest player under Skinner's direction to earn All-America status. Kentucky also matched a program-record with five All-SEC selections for the third time in four seasons in addition to 17 victories in the grueling SEC. For his efforts, Skinner earned AVCA All-South Region Coach of the Year accolades for the first time in his career.

UK continued its run of success stories in 2012 as the Wildcats claimed a 22-11 overall record and

advanced to its third Sweet 16 in the last four seasons. The Wildcats knocked off No. 14 Ohio State in Lexington after having been picked to host a portion of the NCAA Tournament in four of the last five seasons en route to another Regional appearance.

Led by three-time SEC Libero of the Year in Stephanie Klefot - a feat no other player in league history has ever achieved - the Wildcats again had three players selected as All-Americans. Junior Whitney Billings was a second-team selection and joined Klefot and Hartmann (honorable mention selections) as the only trio of teammates to earn consecutive All-America honors in program history. Senior Ashley Frazier was a Senior CLASS award All-America selection honoring excellence achieved both on and off the court.

For the fifth time under Skinner's direction, the Kentucky volleyball program capped the season ranked among the top 25 in the nation to end the 2013 season. UK posted a 22-9 record and an unprecedented ninth-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats finished the season ranked No. 20 and Billings became UK's first-ever three-time All-America selection. Senior Alexandra Morgan became the ninth player in Skinner's tenure to earn All-America accolades.

Memorial Coliseum played host to the opening rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the third time in Skinner's tenure and also hosted the Regional rounds. It marked the first time in program history UK hosted the NCAA Tournament in consecutive weeks.

The 2014 season was highlighted by Skinner becoming the all-time career wins leader in program history. Junior Morgan Bergren claimed second-team All-America accolades and senior Jackie Napper earned the program's fifth league award as the top defensive performer when she was tabbed the Libero of the Year. Napper was joined by classmate Lauren O'Conner as honorable mention All-America honorees. The trio all earned All-SEC honors and were joined by sophomore Anni Thomasson.

UK earned a 27-6 overall record, hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament and finished the season ranked 17th in the country. The final ranking marked the 33rd consecutive poll UK was tabbed a part of - besting the program and Skinner's record of 31-consecutive polls ranked.

In 2015, Skinner guided the Wildcats to their

11th-consecutive NCAA berth following a second place finish in the SEC. Ashley Dusek continued a lineage of success at the libero position, earning SEC Libero of the Year for the first time, while marking the fifth time in six years that a Kentucky player had earned the distinction. Dusek, along with Bergren and Kaz Brown, earned both All-SEC and AVCA All-Region nods. Dusek and Bergren became the Wildcats 26th and 27th AVCA All-America selections, while Bergren became Kentucky volleyball's first ever first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America selection.

In 2016, Skinner took the Cats to the NCAA Tournament once again, and saw four players earn awards for their play after the season. Three players were named to the AVCA All-America team. Leah Edmond found herself on the third team, while Olivia Dailey and Ashley Dusek were Honorable Mention. Edmond had a spectacular season, as she was named All-SEC, SEC Freshman of the Year, All-Region and Region Freshman of the Year. For the second-straight season, Dusek earned the SEC Libero of the Year award, giving UK the award for the sixth time in seven years. The trio of All-Americans were also named All-Region and All-SEC, and were joined by Kaz Brown.

Skinner continued to add to his impressive resume in the final match of the 2015 regular season. With a 3-2 win over Auburn, Skinner eclipsed the 250 career win mark, the first Kentucky volleyball coach to ever do so.

Kentucky has concluded ranked in the final AVCA poll in seven of the last nine seasons.

In addition to on court success, Skinner has also led an impressive youth movement to Lexington, as first-year players have garnered 23 SEC Freshman Player of the Week awards, including Rumely winning the 2006 SEC Freshman of the Year award and most recently, Edmond taking home the honor in 2016. UK has since had at least one first-year player earn All-SEC accolades as Rapp, Becky Pavan, Billings, O'Conner, Sara Schwarzwald, Thomasson, Brown, Brooke Morgan and Edmond have followed suit. Because of immediate success by UK's freshmen, Kentucky is a place top volleyball players in the country are choosing to play collegiality. All nine freshman classes have been ranked in the top-30 in the country including the 2012 class coming as the 15th best in the nation.

In addition to Skinner's success at Kentucky,

he was selected as the head coach of the 2006 U.S. Junior Women's National Team. Skinner led the team to the gold medal in the 2006 Under-20 NORCECA Championships.

Prior to joining the Wildcats, Skinner spent five seasons as an assistant at Nebraska under John Cook and was named head assistant coach in 2003. During his tenure, the Huskers put together a 154-11 record and claimed the 2000 NCAA title with a perfect 34-0 record. The Huskers made a return trip to the Final Four in 2001 and advanced to NCAA regional semifinals or finals in every season after. In Skinner's five years, Nebraska compiled a 97-3 record in Big 12 action and four Big 12 Championships.

Skinner served as defensive coordinator at Nebraska and worked primarily with the middle blockers. He coached three women to six All-America honors during his five-year stay, including Melissa Elmer, who received her second All-America honor in 2004. The Huskers led the nation in blocking in four of the past five seasons. A 1993 graduate of Ball State, Skinner was an outside attacker for the Cardinals and helped guide BSU to a 28-11 record and a third-place finish at the 1990 NCAA Championships. He was a team captain his final two seasons. While attending Ball State, Skinner also served on staff at the Asics Munciana Volleyball Club, helping lead the 18-and-under squad to the U.S. Volleyball Association national runner-up finish in 1992.

A native of Muncie, Ind., Skinner spent three seasons as an assistant coach under Cook at Wisconsin, from 1994-96, aiding the Badgers to a 68-35 record and three postseason appearances, including the 1996 NCAA regional semifinals. Skinner returned to his alma mater in 1999, helping guide the Ball State men to wins over three nationally ranked teams and an 8-4 record at midseason in 2000 before leaving for Nebraska. That team finished the season ranked 13th in the USA Today/AVCA Top 25.

Skinner is married to former Nebraska assistant women's soccer coach Megan Bechtold Skinner. The couple has two daughters, Sophie and Isabel and a son, Eli.

ASSISTANT COACH AND RECRUITING COORDINATOR • EIGHTH SEASON



Lindsey Gray-Walton begins her eighth season as an assistant coach with the Wildcats in 2017 after being hired to the position in January of 2010.

Gray-Walton serves as the Wildcats' recruiting coordinator. Each of her seven signing classes have ranked among the top 25 in the nation by PrepVolleyball.com. The 2016 class ranked No. 5 in the nation and was the highest-ranked in program history.

In her first season with the Blue and White, Gray-Walton helped guide Kentucky to its sixth consecutive winning season and sixth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Gray-Walton and the Wildcats then totaled a 28-6 overall record, a second-place finish in the SEC, a top-15 national ranking to conclude the season and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals in 2011. UK played in front of the largest crowd during the Craig Skinner era in the Regional appearance against top-seeded Texas.

In January of 2012, Gray-Walton was named to the AVCA's "Top 30 Coaches Under 30."

Kentucky's third season with her on staff saw the Blue and White march on to its second-straight Sweet 16 appearance following a 22-11 overall record. UK finished the season ranked No. 20 in the nation.

In 2013, the Wildcats went 22-9 and advanced to

their ninth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Senior Whitney Billings became the program's first-ever three-time All-America selection - all under Gray-Walton's tenure with the team. UK hosted the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Tournament and followed by the NCAA Regionals. It marked the first time in the Skinner era that UK hosted two weekends of the NCAA Tournament in the same season.

The 2014 squad logged a 27-6 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th consecutive season becoming one of just 10 schools in the nation to achieve the feat. Setter Morgan Bergren earned All-America second-team honors, while Jackie Napper became the third player in program history to earn SEC Libero of the Year honors.

In 2015, the Wildcats reached their program-record 11th-consecutive NCAA tournament following a 21-10 season. Kentucky led the SEC in service aces, averaging 1.51 per set in league play. Bergren, along with Ashley Dusek and Kaz Brown, earned All-SEC nods, while Bergren and Dusek took home AVCA All-America honors.

In Gray-Walton's most recent season, the Wildcats went to the NCAA Tournament once again. Gray-Walton helped freshman Leah Edmond earn third-team All-America honors and SEC Freshman of the Year, while Ashley Dusek and Olivia Dailey were also named All-America.

Gray-Walton previously spent a year as the recruiting coordinator for the College of Charleston. She is a 2008 graduate of Georgia Tech where she was an All-Atlantic Coast Conference player.

The College of Charleston went 18-13 overall and fell to Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in 2009. Additionally the Cougars claimed the Southern Conference tournament crown for the conference's automatic bid to the national tournament in Gray's first season with the squad.

At Georgia Tech she was a member of three 20-plus win teams, including a 27-7 team that went 16-0 in ACC play during her freshman season. That team went on to earn an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and defeat Georgia and No. 16 UC Santa Barbara before falling in the Sweet Sixteen to Minnesota. As a junior she was an All-ACC second team member and she also earned ACC Player of the Week honors in 2006.

Gray-Walton concluded her career ranking among the Yellow Jackets' all-time greats as she ranked sixth in career service aces, fifth in service aces per game (0.33) and sixth in the single-season record books with 53 aces in 2006.

Gray-Walton served as coach at summer camps both at Georgia Tech and Emory University throughout her playing career. She also served as the head coach of the Tsunami Volleyball Club based out of Atlanta beginning in 2007.

Gray-Walton graduated in 2008 from Georgia Tech with a Bachelor of Science degree in management, with certificates in both marketing and management.

A native of Olathe, Kan., she married Kyle Walton in May of 2012. Walton is the head coach at nearby Transylvania University. The couple lives in Lexington, and has one daughter, Berkley.

ANDERS NELSON

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • FIFTH SEASON



Anders Nelson begins his fifth season at Kentucky in 2017, first as associate head coach, following his hire in February of 2013.

Nelson serves as UK's camp coordinator and he works directly with UK's middle blockers. He was tabbed one of the AVCA's "Top 30 Coaches Under 30" following his second season with the Blue and White.

In Nelson's most recent season, the Wildcats returned to the NCAA Tournament with a mark of 23-8 and 15-3 in the league. Nelson aided middle blocker Kaz Brown to her second All-SEC and AVCA All-Region nod. Brown averaged 2.58 kills and 1.42 blocks per set during the season. In conference play, Brown's numbers improved to 1.52 blocks per set and 2.94 kills per set.

In 2015, the Wildcats finished at a 21-10 mark, extending their record postseason streak to 11-consecutive years. Nelson aided the team to a league-best opponent hitting percentage, holding SEC foes to just .156 hitting. He also helped Brown to a breakout defensive effort, where she finished third in NCAA Division I for blocks per set, averaging 1.61 per frame en route to her first All-SEC and AVCA All-Region nods.

The 2014 Wildcats claimed a 27-6 overall record and advanced to a 10th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The Wildcats limited opponents

to a .194 hitting percentage for the season while leading the league with 14.25 kills per set. Middle blocker Kaz Brown averaged 1.09 blocks per set and ranked sixth in the league among her position during her freshman campaign.

In 2013, the Wildcats went 22-9 and advanced to their ninth-consecutive NCAA Tournament. Senior middle blocker Alexandra Morgan had a breakout senior campaign earning All-America distinction for the first time in her career and All-Southeastern Conference honors as well. Morgan finished her career ranking first in the 25-point rally scoring era with a career hitting percentage of .355.

Nelson also guided the Wildcat defense to a league-high 2.88 blocks per set within SEC action. Three players ranked in the top 15 for individual blocking, while Morgan and sophomore Sara Schwarzwaldner were both among the top five of league leaders.

Nelson previously spent a year as an assistant at Arkansas and was a volunteer assistant at Kentucky in 2011.

While at Arkansas, the Razorbacks earned a 22-10 overall record which resulted in their first berth in the NCAA Tournament since 2006. Nelson helped guide Arkansas to its highest team hitting percentage in nine seasons, while aiding the recruiting trail as three players ranked in the top-100 by PrepVolleyball.com committed to the program for the 2013 season.

Nelson also served as the camp director for all summer camps in Fayetteville. Attendance rose to its largest numbers in five years under his direction.

Prior to his time at Arkansas, Nelson served as a

volunteer assistant at Kentucky during the 2011 season. The Wildcats advanced to the regional semifinal and finished 28-6 overall en route to capping the year with top-15 national rankings. Nelson worked with Kentucky's middle blockers who averaged 2.56 blocks per set to lead the league and rank in the top 40 nationally.

At the club level, Nelson spent two seasons with the Munciana Volleyball Club. He helped lead the club to the 2011 AAU 18 Open National Championship with a near-perfect record of 66-2. During his tenure with Munciana, he coached three All-America players including Kentucky junior Morgan Bergren who also was tabbed the MVP of the national tournament.

While in the high school coaching ranks, Nelson was an assistant at Muncie Burriss Laboratory High School where the team earned a combined 79-0 record, two state titles and a pair of national runner-up finishes. At Muncie Burriss, Nelson helped coach two Gatorade Players of the Year and nine all-state performers. Nelson was an exceptional player earning American Volleyball Coaches Association All-America second-team honors at Ball State.

A second team All-American, Nelson was also a two-time All-MIVA performer while serving as the team captain for the three seasons. During his senior campaign, he ranked fourth in the nation for total blocks and finished second in the "Off the Block" National Blocker of the Year voting.

Nelson is a 2011 graduate of Ball State University where he graduated summa cum laude with a finance and accounting degree.

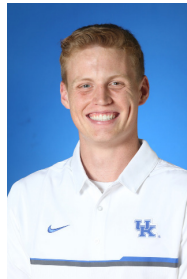

MEMORIAL COLISEUM RECORDS

Memorial Coliseum is a tremendous home-court advantage for the Kentucky volleyball team, which plays all of its matches in the historic facility.

The Wildcats have compiled a 409-156 record, good for a .725 winning percentage in 39 seasons of play in the facility. Under Craig Skinner, Kentucky is an astounding 155-37 (.810) at home.

The Coliseum has played host to first-and second-round NCAA volleyball action as well as the 1983 NCAA Volleyball Final Four. It played host to NCAA Regionals in 2011, 2013 and 2015. Memorial also currently serves as the home court for the UK women's basketball and gymnastics teams. The storied gymnasium also housed some of the greatest moments in UK men's basketball history as its home for 26 seasons from 1950 to 1976.

UK's first appearance in the tournament was in 1983 under co-head coaches Marilyn McReavy and Mary Jo Peppler. In that tournament, UK advanced to the Sweet 16 before losing to Hawaii in the regional finals.

Skinner again led the Wildcats to NCAA appearances in 2016, 2015 and 2014. In 2016, UK advanced to the second round, defeating Colorado State. In 2014, UK played host to the First and Second Rounds for the fifth time in seven seasons. The Wildcats downed Oakland before falling in a tough four-set match to Ohio State.

Skinner directed the Wildcats to a school-best ninth-straight NCAA Tournament in 2012. UK earned the tournament's No. 15 overall seed and played host to the First and Second Rounds. UK defeated Duquesne before falling to Michigan State. Memorial Coliseum then hosted the NCAA Regionals with eventual-national champion Penn State emerging from UK's pod.

Kentucky earned the tournament's No. 16 overall seed and played host to the opening rounds for the third time in the last five seasons. UK took down East Tennessee State and No. 14 Ohio State to advance to its second-straight Sweet 16. Kentucky eventually fell to No. 1 Penn State in the NCAA regionals.

In 2011, UK knocked off Dayton and host Texas A&M in the opening rounds of play to make its way back to Lexington for the NCAA Regionals on its home floor. UK gave No. 1-seeded Texas all it could handle before falling in four sets in front of the largest crowd to witness a volleyball match in the Skinner era.

UK continued its historic stretch with a sixth-consecutive tournament appearance in 2010. The Wildcats traveled to West Lafayette, Ind., before falling in four sets to the No. 16 seed Purdue Boilermakers.

In 2009, UK hosted the first and second rounds for the second straight season and swiftly moved through the Lexington site with sweeps of Michigan State and 13th-seeded Oregon to advance to the Sweet 16 for the first time under Skinner.

Kentucky served as the host of the first and second rounds in 2008 for the first time since 1993. The Blue and White dropped a thrilling five-set match to Michigan in front of one of the largest crowds ever at Memorial Coliseum.

UK met Michigan State in the opening round of action in 2007 before falling in three sets to an impressive Spartan squad.

In 2006, the Wildcats headed north to West Lafayette, Ind., for a showdown with No. 20 Ohio, which Kentucky toppled in a five-game thriller to give the Cats their first NCAA Tournament win since Dec. 3, 1992. The

Wildcats fell to host Purdue the next night in a 3-0 sweep.

In 2005, Kentucky squared off with 2005 Atlantic Coast Conference champion Maryland in the Louisville Gardens. The Terrapins used powerful blocking to overpower the Cats 3-1 in the tournament's opening round. In 1993, Fran Flory's first year with the program, the Cats hosted the first and second rounds but suffered a 3-0 loss to Duke after a first-round bye.

UK made its best two showings in the tournament in 1983 and 1987 when the team won its first match at the South Regional Championships to be included among the final eight teams in the tournament before losing to Hawaii and Texas, respectively, by 3-1 scores in the regional final. McReavy and Peppler's '83 team and the '87 team coached by Kathy DeBoer both used Memorial Coliseum's home-court advantage to sweep through their first-round matches.

Collegiate volleyball championships began in 1970 with the first event held in Long Beach, Calif. Under the auspices of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, the tournament continued to flourish through 1981 when the NCAA began its sponsorship. The NCAA has remained the host ever since.

The University of Kentucky and Memorial Coliseum were honored to serve as the hosts for the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships in 1983, won by Hawaii over UCLA, 3-0. The field for the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championships was expanded from 56 to 64 teams in 1998. The tournament's first expansion was in 1993, increasing the field from 32 to 48 teams.

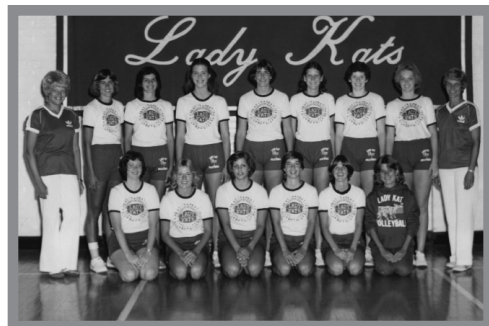

UK'S VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1979

In only its third year of existence, the Kentucky volleyball squad put together a 35-18-1 record and the Wildcats did not even drop a game against SEC foes to win the first SEC title in the sport of volleyball. UK, which played 44 of its 54 matches away from Memorial Coliseum, advanced to the AIAW National Championships in Carbondale, Ill., after finishing first in the Region II Tournament held in Lexington. UK Coach Delphine Nemeth was named the KWIC Coach of the Year. The title established the Wildcats, who also won the SEC Tournament with a perfect 5-0 sweep through league foes, as a volleyball power.



1980

Kentucky won an impressive 39 matches and again swept through the SEC Tournament en route to its second consecutive league crown. Kim Clay was named to the SEC All-Tournament team for the second consecutive season, joining teammate Sandy Glasscock. The Wildcats, who finished first in the AIAW Region II Tournament, notched their first win in the AIAW National Tournament that year with a 2-0 victory over Northwestern in Santa Barbara, Calif. The Cats did not drop a match to an in-state foe and were a perfect 6-0 at home, making them the team to beat in the SEC.



1983

The Kentucky volleyball team posted a school-best 44 victories as the Wildcats won their third SEC title with a perfect 5-0 league record. Lexington was the site of the SEC Tournament and the Cats defeated Ole Miss and Tennessee for their first tournament title under the single-elimination format. Karolyn Kirby was an all-SEC selection after hitting an impressive .311 on the season. Coaches Marilyn McReavy and Mary Jo Peppler were named SEC Coaches of the Year. UK was rewarded for its success in the regular season with its first NCAA Tournament berth and first-round hosting privileges. The Cats advanced past North Carolina and defeated Texas in its own regional in Austin, Texas before falling to perennial power Hawaii the following night. Kentucky finished fifth in the NCAA that season.



1987

Kentucky notched a 31-2 record, including a perfect 7-0 mark in SEC play and a 15-0 home record, to win its fourth SEC championship. After beginning the season 7-1, the Wildcats put together a 24-match win streak before falling to Texas in the NCAA Regional. The Cats breezed through the SEC Tournament in Baton Rouge, La., with sweeps of Mississippi State, Tennessee and Florida. UK coach Kathy DeBoer was named both the league's Coach of the Year and the NCAA Coach of the Year. Lisa Dausman was named the Most Valuable Player of the SEC Tournament and an All-SEC selection after hitting a stellar .336 on the year. UK swept N.C. State and Texas-Arlington in the NCAA Tournament before falling to the Longhorns on their home court to end the season.



1988

Kentucky claimed its second consecutive SEC title with a 26-7 record and a 7-0 mark in league play. Senior Lisa Bokovy was an All-SEC selection and also was named to the SEC All-Tournament team, completing her career with a then-school-best 1,657 kills, 3,739 digs, a .329 hitting percentage, 147 service aces and 1,057 blocks. She was the first Wildcat to notch more than 1,000 kills and 1,000 blocks in her career. The Cats swept through the SEC Tournament in Pensacola, Fla., with wins over LSU and Tennessee. After winning a 3-2 thriller at home in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against New Mexico, UK fell to Texas-Arlington in the NCAA Regionals in Austin, Texas.

UK AT THE SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Predating the run of dominance in the Southeastern Conference by the Florida Gators during the 1990s, the Kentucky Wildcats set the standard of play in the conference during the '70s and '80s. From 1979 to 1989, the Wildcats won five SEC regular-season titles that preceded five SEC tournament championships. On two more occasions the Cats were the SEC Tournament runners-up, making 1981, 1982, 1985 and 1986 the only years during that 11-year span in which the Cats did not compete in the tournament's title match. While falling short of the championship match in those four seasons, UK was a three-time consolation champion ('82, '85, '86).

In the inaugural SEC Tournament of 1979, UK swept the competition behind Kim Clay and her first of three SEC All-Tournament selections, as the Cats won their first of two straight SEC tourney titles. With 1980 serving as the last year for the tournament's double-elimination format, UK successfully defended its home court against five opponents to win the crown.

UK claimed both regular season and tournament championship honors in 1983 with Marsha Bond leading the way and earning her third SEC All-Tournament team honors. Karolyn Kirby was also named to the All-Tournament team in '83. The Cats lost in the championship match in 1984 after finishing the regular season second in the conference. During these two years, the SEC Tournament featured just the top four teams and required just two wins to earn the title.

In 1987 and '88, the Cats capped off their fourth and fifth perfect SEC regular seasons by sweeping through the tournament each time. Laura Linder and Kim Thompson were named to the All-Tournament team on both occasions as head coach Kathy DeBoer's program reached elite status in college volleyball.

Although the Wildcats have not played in the championship match since 1989, a return to those previous days of glory appears within reach under second-year head coach Craig Skinner. The Cats posted their best league record since the 1993 season with a 10-6 mark in 2005.

The University of Kentucky is one of only four member institutions to earn multiple SEC Volleyball tournament titles and its five tournament championships are second only to Florida's 11.

Following the 2005 season, the league's coaches voted to play home-and-home series with each opponent instead of participating in a conference tournament.
