AN ACT TO REPEAL THE EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY
(EXTERNAL RELATIONS) ACT, 1936, TO DECLARE
THAT THE DESCRIPTION OF THE STATE SHALL BE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE OIREACHTAS AS FOLLOWS :—

1.—The Executive Authority (External Relations) Act, 1936 15
(No. 58 of 1936), is hereby repealed.

2.—It is hereby declared that the description of the State shall be
the Republic of Ireland.

3.—The President, on the authority and on the advice of the
Government, may exercise the executive power or any executive 20
function of the State in or in connection with its external relations.

Commencement.

4.—This Act shall come into operation on such day as the Govern-
ment may by order appoint.
